HYBRID ATTENDANCE REMINDER

For the purpose of our second-semester hybrid schedule, we will be implementing an "open campus" that will allow students to arrive prior to their first academic class and leave after their final academic class. For example, if a student has a fourth-period lunch/study hall, then they will be allowed to leave after their third-period class. In addition, should students have fifth-period lunch/study hall then they would not need to report to school until their sixth-period class begins. Open campus applies to study hall and lunch for periods 1, 4, 5, and 8 only. Attendance will default to present for those study halls and lunch periods.
