STUDENT PARKING VIOLATIONS

Parents and Students: Please read the parking expectations below. Starting on 4/19, SEHS will enforce the following:

Student Parking Expectations:

A current valid student permit is required to park in the SEHS student parking areas. Students must park in their designated student parking numbered space indicated on their parking tag. Parking in the visitor's lot or a non-numbered space, may result in a \$25 parking ticket. Repeated violations may result in TOWING.
