
NEW OR GENTLY USED BACK PACKS NEEDED

Golden Apple Scholars program: Eligibility requirements:

* Illinois High School Senior

* U.S. citizen or eligible non-citizen (DACA recipients) and resident of Illinois

*ACADEMIC REQUIREMENTS:

Every <u>application</u> submitted receives a holistic review. This means every piece of your application is reviewed and considered to make a decision. One single item does not determine your application decision.

Standardized test scores (ACT or SAT) are optional and not required for acceptance this year. Due Date 12/1/2023

Fox Valley Citizens for Peace & Justice Scholarship: Seniors; be enrolled in or have an application pending at an accredited college. The scholarship committee will determine the recipient based on his/her recommendation and essay. Applications are available in the guidance office. Due Date 4/5/24

CBAI Foundation For Community Bank: The competition is open to Illinois high school seniors who are sponsored by a CBAI member bank; it's not based on financial need. Students are asked to write a one-page essay on the theme: "What is a community bank and how does it affect the economy?" Submit all the forms to a sponsoring bank. Applications available in the guidance office. Due Date 3/1/2024

BWA-Black Women's Association Scholarship: Seniors of African-American descent; who have demonstrated a strong scholastic ability and achievement, creativity (scholastic or artistic), peer relationships, integrity, community involvement of theirvolunteerism, and leadership.
