

What is Dual Credit?

Elgin Community College and its partner School Districts offer several dual credit programs that allow high school students to enroll in college courses. Students earn simultaneous high school and college credit. The programs provide a way to save time and money towards attaining a higher education, experience college life, and prepare for a successful transition after high school.

A quick summary of the programs available are outlined below. Each Dual Credit program offers a unique opportunity to students.

Full-Time Dual Credit Program

- Senior enrollment (One-year program)
- Junior enrollment (Two-year program)
- Earn 24+ transferable credits each year
- Minimum of 12 credit hours each semester
- Courses are chosen from the Assoicate of Arts or Science degree plan

Part-Time Program: General Education

- Senior Enrollment All qualifying students
- Junior Enrollment Dual Language students only
- Courses offered at the high school building
- Enrolled in 1-2 courses each semester
- Maximum of 7 credit hours each semester
- Courses available in English, Math, Spanish & Basic Nursing Assistant Program/CNA

How Do I Get Started?

In learning about dual credit offerings, it is important students meet with their high school counselor and discuss the specifics of each program. Below is a summary of the programs' structure, expectations, and qualifications. Students should direct questions about the program options to their high school counselor.

This information should help students determine which option best aligns with their academic plan and interests. For options where the student attends classes on the ECC campus, students are responsible for their transportation. A representative from the high school will share information about tuition, fees, and other costs related to the different dual credit programs.

Each School District or Private School determines the dual credit offerings that students are eligible to participate in as part of their high school education. School District U-46 has elected to offer the following programs in partnership with Elgin Community College.

FULL-TIME DUAL CREDIT PROGRAM

High school juniors and seniors enroll in a minimum of 12 college credits each semester. Juniors must stay on pace to complete the 60-credit hour degree requirement within their two academic years (i.e. 15 credit hours in each fall/spring semester). All courses are completed at the ECC main campus; either in person or online. These courses meet the postsecondary requirements of the general education core curriculum as well as high school graduation.

Students work in partnership with the ECC Academic Advising Office and the U-46 lead counselor to choose the appropriate transferable courses. Students that enroll as juniors work to complete the course requirements to earn an Associate in Arts or Associate in Science degree. School District U-46 approves the enrollment of their students. Enrollment is limited – For more questions, please contact your high school representative.

PART-TIME DUAL CREDIT PROGRAM

High school juniors (course dependent) and seniors enroll in courses each semester. Courses offered at the high schools are selected from a variety of academic disciplines, including general education (i.e., English and math).

Students choose courses with the help of their high school counselor to ensure courses selected meet high school requirements. School District U-46 approves the enrollment of their students. Enrollment is limited (course offerings vary by high school – For more questions, please contact your high school representative).

FULL-TIME DUAL CREDIT

SENIOR ENROLLMENT (1-YEAR PROGRAM)

- Students enroll in 4-5 courses each semester at the ECC campus
- Courses add up to a minimum of 12 credit hours each semester
- Students may earn 24+ transferable credits
- Students complete COL 101-College Success during their first semester
- Students are required to attend Friday meetings with the U-46 lead counselor
- Course options are selected by ECC and the school district to ensure they meet the student's high school graduation requirements
- Students meet with ECC's academic advising department to develop academic plan
- Students are responsible for transportation to their high school for after school activities
- Students may participate in IHSA sports at their high school
- Students are responsible for the cost of their books

JUNIOR ENROLLMENT (2-YEAR PROGRAM)

- Students enroll in 4-5 courses each semester at the ECC campus
- Complete 60 credits/degree requirements in two years (i.e. 15 credits per semester)
- Summer courses may be required between junior and senior year
- Students complete COL 101-College Success during the first semester and GSD 120-Exploring Careers and College Majors in the second semester.
- Students are required to attend Friday meetings with the U-46 lead counselor
- ECC academic advisors guide students in selecting classes that meet their college plans
- Students are responsible for transportation to their high school for after school activities
- Students may participate in IHSA sports at their high school
- Students are responsible for the cost of their books

Courses will be scheduled Monday-Friday. Students may be in class from 8:00 a.m. to 3:15 p.m. Some courses may be scheduled outside of this timeframe. If courses are offered outside of this timeframe, the dual credit office will ensure that students and school counselors are informed in advance. Students are expected to commit to this timeframe and must understand that scheduling of classes is managed by the dual credit office. **NOTE** – **Due to the ongoing pandemic, students should expect to have one or more online courses.**

Class sections (days, times, and instructors) are pre-selected by ECC to meet the needs of the program. Class schedules will not accommodate students' work schedules if it falls within the timeframe noted above. The ECC academic calendar differs from the school

districts' calendar. Students in the full time dual credit program are expected to follow the ECC academic calendar

PROGRAM QUALIFICATIONS

- Must be and remain a School District U-46 student in good standing
- Current sophomore or junior at the time of application
- Strongly recommend to have a 3.00 cumulative unweighted high school GPA at the time of application
- Must maintain a 2.00 GPA while enrolled at ECC
- Demonstrate college-readiness Must have qualifying scores (PSAT/SAT/ACT or ECC Placement Tests)
- Meet other high school requirements as noted by U-46 district policies
- All students must submit a dual credit U-46 agreement
- Enrollment is limited and determined by the school district

PART-TIME DUAL CREDIT

IN-HIGH SCHOOL

- Current junior OR sophomore/junior in the Dual Language program at the time of application
- Students enroll in 1-3 courses each semester
- Maximum of 9 credit hours each semester
- Course options offered at the high school
- Course options are pre-selected by the school district
- Enrollment is limited and determined by the school district

PROGRAM QUALIFICATIONS

- Current sophomore or junior at the time of application
- Strongly recommend to have a 3.00 cumulative unweighted high school GPA at the time of application
- Demonstrate college-readiness Must have qualifying scores (PSAT/SAT/ACT or ECC Placement Tests)
- Meet other high school requirements as noted by U-46 district policies

PART-TIME IN-HIGH SCHOOL DUAL CREDIT COURSES

The course options available to part-time dual credit students are listed below. Course descriptions are available at <u>www.elgin.edu/catalog.</u>

Course availability varies by high school building. Courses may be available in an online/ concurrent format. The following is helpful when selecting courses with the help of your school counselor:

General Education: These courses fulfill a general education core requirement. As part of students' baccalaureate education, a series of courses in varying disciplines are required prior/during the completion of specified (i.e. Major/Minor) courses that are selected for the program of study that is being completed. These courses have a high transferability rate and are typically completed within the first couple of years in college. **NOTE:** *All General Education courses can also count as elective credit.*

Elective: These courses help a student towards the successful completion of their required elective hours. Each program/institution sets a minimum of courses that students must complete separate from general education and major/minor specific courses. Often, these courses serve to fulfill a prerequisite in a math or science sequence.

Prerequisite: Courses that required the successful (C or better) completion of another course in order to continue in the specified sequence (i.e. Biology, Chemistry, Mathematics, and/or Physics) are marked as "Prerequisite". These courses will also satisfy either a general education core requirement or count as elective credit.

If you are interested in the full-time dual credit program, submit the Dual Credit U-46 Interest form found at u-46.org/dualcredit. <u>You will not be considered for the full-time</u> <u>program if this form is not submitted.</u> Once you have completed the Initial Interest form, you will receive the Dual Credit Application and Testing Guide. It will provide you with instructions on the next steps for the program
