

If concerns cannot be resolved directly with the teacher, reach out to building and district administrators or directors of specific departments (i.e. Transportation, Information Services, Multilingual-Multicultural Education, Early Childhood, Specialized Student Services, etc.)

Try to attend PTO/PTA meetings or school events.


Participate in parent-teacher conferences, open houses, and workshops to stay informed and build relationships with teachers and staff.

Let's Talk


Reach out to the district through the online system called Let's Talk to ask questions or give feedback on how well things are going or provide recommendations on we we can do things better.








Let's Talk




U-46 Board Meetings The Board of Education is responsible for determining the policies which guide the operation of School District U-46. State law holds school boards responsible for policies in these areas: approval of courses of study and textbooks, adoption of an annual budget, construction, furnishing and maintenance of facilities, employment and evaluation of the superintendent.

Magnet Academies

<u>Magnet Academy</u>: A unique, focused program housed within a comprehensive high school.
 Students apply to be in the program freshman year and remain in the program through senior year.

U-46 Magnet Program Goals:

- 1. Promote a culturally linguistic, inclusive, and safe environment for all to focus on teaching and learning.
- 2. Deliver a highly engaging and rigorous innovative curriculum.
- 3. Work collaboratively with businesses and the community to enrich the student experience.
- 4. Sustain high levels of achievement for students enrolled in Magnet programs.
- 5. Provide exemplary service that supports students' academic and social-emotional growth.

Magnet Academies

- Students are admitted through an application and review process. Eighth graders will submit completed Magnet Academy applications online.
- Eighth graders can apply for admission to one of the five Magnet Academy programs:
 - BEACON Magnet Academy of Media and Digital Arts at South Elgin High School
 - International Baccalaureate Academy/Gifted and Talented Academy at Elgin High School
 - Science, Engineering, and High Technology Magnet Academy at Bartlett High School
 - Visual and Performing Arts Magnet Academy at Larkin High School
 - Leadership, Entrepreneurship, Action, and Design (LEAD) Magnet Academy at Streamwood High School

Magnet Academies Application

- Students will apply via our website: https://apply.u-46.org/
- Application opens on September 25th and closes on October 25th
- Application requirements: 2.0 GPA and 2 letters or recommendation
 - Application allows students to gain preferences or priorities
- Students only need to apply to the academies that they are interested in attending

Magnet Academies Application Process

Preferences

• **Preferences** allow for students in these categories to gain automatic acceptance into the magnet program *provided they meet the minimum qualifications*.

Priorities

• Priorities allow for students to gain additional entries into the lottery if they meet the minimum qualifications and show evidence of meeting the additional criteria.

Priorities Preferences

- **Sibling**: Students with a 9th-11th grade sibling enrolled in the academy
- Project Access: Students who are homeless or in a temporary living situation

Priorities

- Geographic Location: Students who live in the geographic boundaries of the school (1)
- Program Participation: students who participate in identified middle school coursework, extra curricular activities or community based programming (1)
- Free or Reduced Lunch: students who receive free or reduced lunch (2)

Supporting All Students

- Brothers Rise Up (BRU) was established by Mr. Jim Cook to support male students (grades 3-8) as they become leaders. A young man is nominated by his school staff for this multi-year experience that provides ongoing support throughout his years in the District.
- The students are primarily African-American; however, Hispanic/Latino students and students of two or more races are also members.

BRU offers lessons based on character development, social skills, leadership, academic excellence and career development.


