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# OVERVIEW

There are specific courses required for graduation (for example, physical education) and a variety of *core* courses (in English, Math & Science) and *elective* courses (that you can choose based on interest and career aspirations).

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# COURSE SELECTION SHEETS

When reviewing the course selection sheet, you will need to indicate what you are interested in. Just like right now, there are eight periods a day in high school. Your freshman year, you have to take 3 *core* courses (in English, Math & Science), 1 Physical Education course (a *graduation requirement*) and *elective* courses (that you can choose based on interest and career aspirations).
