Course Description

Family and Consumer Science (FACS): Culinary and Personal Success provides opportunities for students to learn in a real-world, hands-on environment. Using essential employability competencies as a guide, students will develop and apply skills related to leadership, communication, collaboration and financial literacy. Students will be introduced to culinary fundamentals including safety, personal nutrition, and food preparation in culinary labs. Students will relate their own family functions, structures and traditions to the real world. Finally, students will investigate their personal interests and abilities to prepare for college and careers.


.Final grades posted to a report card will be calculated with the following weights: 70% - Summative Assessment Scores 20% - Formative Assessment Scores 10% - Intentional
