I hope this message finds you well. I want to take a moment to stress the importance of the upcoming **Illinois Assessment of Readiness (IAR)** and the critical role that attendance plays in ensuring student success.

Each spring, students across Illinois participate in **federally required state assessments** to help us understand their academic growth and performance compared to their peers statewide. The



IAR, which measures student achievement in **English Language Arts and Math**, is a key tool in identifying strengths and areas for improvement. The results also help the state provide additional support and resources to schools that need them most.

At Kenyon Woods, our **IAR testing dates** are scheduled for:

March 12th, 13th, and 14th

Students will complete **three math units and two English Language Arts units** over multiple days. The test format remains the same as in previous years, ensuring that our students are familiar with the structure and expectations.

I cannot stress enough the importance of **students being present on these testing days.** Please make every effort to ensure that your child is **on time**, **well-rested**, **and ready to do their best**. In addition to helping us measure student progress, **IAR results are also used for placement in math and English courses, as well as high school course recommendations**. Strong performance on these assessments can open doors to advanced coursework and additional academic opportunities.












The Importance of Developing Reasoning Skills in Learning

In today's fast-paced and ever-changing world, the ability to think critically and reason logically is more essential than ever. As parents, fostering strong reasoning skills in your children is one of the best ways to set them up for success in academics and beyond. Developing these skills not only enhances problemsolving abilities but also prepares children for real-world challenges.

Why are reasoning skills so important? Reasoning skills enable children to analyze information, draw logical conclusions, and make informed decisions. These abilities play a critical role in subjects like mathematics, science, reading comprehension, and even social interactions. When children learn how to think critically, they become more independent learners, capable of evaluating different perspectives and solving problems effectively.

Moreover, strong reasoning skills contribute to:

- **Better Academic Performance:** Students who develop reasoning skills can grasp complex concepts more easily and apply their knowledge across various subjects.
- **Improved Decision-Making**: Whether choosing friends, resolving conflicts, or planning future goals, reasoning skills help children make sound choices.
- **Enhanced Communication:** The ability to construct logical arguments and express thoughts clearly is a valuable asset in discussions and debates.

In what ways can adults at home assist with to develop reasoning skills at home

1. Encourage Curiosity and Questions

Children are naturally inquisitive, and their questions provide a great opportunity to nurture reasoning. Instead of simply giving answers, ask them, "What do you think?" or "Why do you think that happens?" This encourages them to analyze situations and think critically.

2. Promote Problem-Solving Activities

Engage children in puzzles, brain teasers, and logic games that require them to strategize and think critically. Board games like chess or Sudoku can significantly boost logical thinking. Set up a table or a space for the family to put a 1000-piece puzzle over a period of time and discuss strategies to solve the puzzle together.

3. Support Decision-Making

Give your child opportunities to make choices and explain their reasoning. Whether selecting an outfit for the day or deciding how to spend their allowance, guiding them through the decision-making process fosters analytical thinking.

4. Discuss Real-World Situations

Encourage children to think through current events, ethical dilemmas, or family discussions. Ask open-ended questions like, "What would you do in this situation?" or "What are the possible consequences of this choice?"

5. Encourage Reading and Storytelling

Reading books that involve mystery, problem-solving, or moral dilemmas helps children develop inferential thinking. Asking questions like, "Why do you think the character did that?" promotes deeper analysis. The same can be done with movie watching. Discuss the movie and encourage analysis.

6. Model Logical Thinking

Children learn by example, so demonstrate how to reason through challenges. Talk through your decision-making process aloud, showing them how to weigh pros and cons logically.

Developing reasoning skills is a vital aspect of your child's education and future success. By fostering critical thinking at home, you empower them with the tools needed to navigate the complexities of learning and life. Encouraging curiosity, engaging in problem-solving activities, and modeling logical thinking will help your child become a confident and independent thinker, ready to face any challenge with a clear and reasoned approach.
