Can You Believe May Is Almost Here?

It's hard to believe, but **May 1st is just around the corner**, and the end of the school year is quickly approaching! As we dive into the final stretch, please keep a close eye on the **important dates listed below**, and have conversations with your student about upcoming **deadlines**, **expectations**, **and events**.



With so many exciting activities happening around school, it's easy to lose focus. Please encourage your student to **stay on track**, **attend class on time**, **and make responsible choices** to ensure they're eligible to participate in all the fun end-of-year celebrations.

i-Ready Diagnostic Testing – April 28 & 29 (Monday & Tuesday)

It's also hard to believe, but it's already time for the **end-of-year i-Ready Diagnostic**! This is a critical benchmark that helps us measure your student's **growth and progress in reading and mathematics** over the course of the school year. The assessment provides teachers with valuable data to help personalize instruction and plan for next steps in learning.

What is i-Ready?

i-Ready is an **online**, **adaptive assessment** that adjusts in difficulty based on how your child responds to each question. The goal is not to assign a score or grade, but to determine how to best support each student's learning moving forward.

Testing will take place first thing in the morning on Monday and Tuesday, April 28th and 29th.

Please help your student be prepared by ensuring the following:

- ✓ Bring their charged Chromebook and charger to school
- ✓ Get a good night's sleep and eat a healthy breakfast
- ✓ Try their best and don't rush through questions
- ✓ Understand it's normal to get some questions wrong—that's how the test works!

- ✓ Use scratch paper for math questions to show their thinking

REMINDER ABOUT DRESS GUIDELINES

With the warm weather we tend to see quite a few new fashion styles. While they may be in style for going out, they are not always appropriate for school. Please check what your student is wearing before they leave for school. If you question it, it is probably not right for school. Students can choose clothing that makes them feel comfortable and safe, as long as it complies with the following guidelines:

- 1. Does not depict any violence, hatred, drugs, alcohol, gang affiliation, profanity, phobic language, sexual content or cruelty of any kind
- 2. Covers all appropriate areas at all times. Appropriate areas include: stomach, chest and sides (both male and female) and butt/pelvic/upper thigh areas.
- 3. Items such as tank tops, sleeveless shirts, any type of shorts, coats, jackets, etc. are all allowed provided they adhere to #2 of this Section. (Low backs are not a problem)
- 4. Jewelry is allowed, unless it becomes a safety concern.
- 5. Hats, hoods, and other types of head coverings are not allowed unless required for religious or medical purposes.
- 6. Footwear must be worn for health reasons (cannot go shoeless). **Due to safety concerns, Flip Flops and Slides are not to be worn in school.**







TATTOOS WILL BE SOLD DURING LUNCH FROM APRIL 22 THROUGH APRIL 30TH.




FROM THE CREATIVE MINDS OF OUR PANTHERS








PICTURES OF THE WEEK






SCHOOL SAFETY MEASURES
