Science (Tornberg/Saini): We are rolling in Science class, literally. This week we rolled marbles of different masses, and at different speeds, down ramps. This was to describe the relationship of kinetic energy to the mass of an object and to the speed of an object. This is our first standard of the school year. The students made measurements, collected data, and graphed their results. The students completed a couple of formative assessments before the summative test these last few days. Grades are updated and current. Please reach out if you have any questions or concerns. Potential Energy will be our main focus during the next standard

Math (Brazee): We have been learning about Exponents and Scientific Notation in 8th grade math. Students already learned how to use the properties of exponents to simplify exponential expressions and they're currently learning how to answer word problems by dividing, adding, and subtracting numbers written in scientific notation. We are coming up on the end of our first module and will have a summative test on Friday, 9/13/24. Afterwards, we will move into the "Rational Numbers" module. Students are given problems in class to work on and they're recommended to continue working on them at home. I always recommend having your child complete at least a couple problems similar to what they did in class each day to reinforce their knowledge. US Hist Elko/Lemel): In U.S. History, we finished Ch 2: Exploring The Americas with a summative on Sept 9th. Students completed an Explorer Villain/Hero project that should have been turned in on the 9th as well. We have started Ch 3: Colonial America, During Chapter 3 students will be completing peer to peer notes and sharing what they learned with their team.
