Special Needs Program Series Focuses on 'Continued Social Deficits' on Feb. 27

For special needs students, appropriate social behavior is much more than just the ability to interact and get along with others. It is a major cog in a student's ability to become more independent, achieve greater daily function and attain emotional well-being. Conversely, a limited social range can have negative effects.

"<u>The Challenges Resulting from Continued</u> <u>Social Deficits: Solutions and Strategies</u>" is an hourlong program being presented at 6:30 p.m. Tuesday, Feb. 27 at the Poplar Creek Library, 1405 S. Park Ave., Streamwood. It will also feature a question-and-answer session. Parents will



leave with a better understanding of how social functioning affects their special needs student and tips tips to help promote a child's social growth.

The speakers are Dr. Vanessa Wells and Dr. Joey Williams, psychologists from Advanced Behavioral Solutions who specialize in the treatment of young people with neurocognitive and behavioral disorders.

This is the fourth and final 2017-18 program presented by the U-46 Citizens' Advisory Council's Specialized Student Services Committee. The event is free and requires no registration.
