Message From the Principal

Hello Abbott parents, students, and staff!

Can you believe it is already February? It seems like time is flying by. Please take some time to check in with your child to see how they are doing by logging into the Infinite Campus Parent Portal or



sit down with your child and have them log in for you. In Infinite Campus, you can see how your child is doing academically. Please contact your student's teachers if you have any questions about any zeros or missing assignments. In Infinite Campus, you can also view your child's attendance and tardies.

As we get further into the school year, we would like to remind you of the importance of good attendance and being on time to classes for all students. Good attendance and being on time are important life skills for the future.

Every time a student is tardy to school or class, they are missing the first minutes of class where our teachers are often reviewing, giving instruction, or giving directions for the day. We have seen an increase is student tardies this school year. When a student enters a classroom late, this often causes the class to loose focus or the teacher to have to repeat missed instructions. We need your partnership! Please discuss the importance of being on time with your child.

Every day a student is absent is a lost opportunity for learning. Too many absences not only can affect achievement for the absent student but also can disrupt learning for the entire class. Research shows that students who consistently miss school are at risk of lower academic achievement. If your child is healthy, they should be in school.

Chronic Absenteeism

Most children miss a few days of school each year without long-term consequences. However, when they miss many days, the effects are almost always negative. If your child has missed 10 days or more of school (approximately 2 says a month), he or she is considered chronically

absent. Over the course of a student's high school career, missing 10 percent of school days would equate to missing almost an entire semester of school.

What Can Families Do?

Attending school regularly helps children feel better about school and themselves.

What you can do:


- Avoid scheduling vacations when school is in session. They are marked vacation, but they are still considered unexcused absences.
- Build regular routines for bedtime and the morning.
- Have your child turn off the screens when it is time to go to sleep.
- Have your child lay out clothes and pack backpacks the night before.
- Talk about the importance of regular attendance and about how your child feels about school.
- Don't permit missing school unless your child is sick.
- If your child seems anxious about going to school, **talk to teachers, school counselors, or other parents** for advice on how to make him/her feel comfortable and excited about learning.
- Avoid medical appointments when school is in session if possible.
- **Develop back up plans** for getting to school if something comes up. Ask a family member, neighbor or another parent for help.

Attendance Notifications

Automated Attendance Notifications are sent to parents whose children are marked "absent" on a given school day.

We also realize that there are a number of **excused reasons** why your child may be late to school. **Please call the school if your child is going to be absent. Our office number is 847-888-5160.** We thank you for partnering with us to help your child succeed. Attendance matters!
