We are a Dual Language District. The award-winning U-46 80:20 Dual Language program model serves more than 10,000 K-8 grade students in 33 of our elementary schools and five middle schools with expansion to five high schools scheduled for 2018-19.

- We screen all students for eligibility in our gifted programming. We currently serve 1,591 students in grades 4-8 in gifted education.
- High school students can select from up to 25 Advanced Placement Courses at our five high schools.
- We offer five selective enrollment high school academies and we'll expand these small learning environments at all our high schools by 2020.
- The District has earned national accreditations in some of our Career and Technical Education programs, including automotive accreditations and precision manufacturing.
- The District's specialized needs programming features special transition programs for young adults who have completed four years of high school and are between 18 and 21 years old.
- The District enjoys robust partnerships with local organizations and businesses, many of whom belong to the Alignment Collaborative for Education, which builds community-wide capacity to support the District's vision and priorities.
