I am writing today to tell you that our plans to re-open for grades Pre-K to 2nd for the in-person hybrid model must be delayed. Today, two staff members in our Transportation Department were confirmed to be positive with COVID-19 within a 28 hour time period. As such, the Kane County Health Department declared an outbreak at our Shales Parkway facility and has sent home nine additional staff members to quarantine for a minimum of 14 days.

We cannot serve 5,000 students in pre-k to 2nd grade without a functioning Transportation Department. At this time, we do not have dispatchers available to guide drivers, respond to parent calls, and ensure students can be safely transported.

Because of this delay, students in pre-k to 2nd grade will remain with their current teacher. We will not proceed with shifting those schedules until such time as we begin the hybrid model. At this time, I cannot commit to a date that will occur.

We will continue to serve our self-contained special education classes and transition programming (Center House, SEHS, and SWEP), Exceptional Needs (EN), Individual Learning Programs (ILP), Modified Learning Program (MLP), and Deaf and Hard of Hearing (DHH). Transportation services for these programs all operate out of our second transportation facility located on Chicago Street in Elgin.

I am so sorry that the virus is once again affecting you. We all were looking forward to seeing the smiling eyes of our youngest learners as they returned for their second "first day" of school. I know that day will come. It just is not yet.

## **Benefits Enrollment**

Enrollment for your 2021 employee benefits gets underway on Friday, Oct. 23 and is open through Tuesday, Nov. 10. New this year, the 2021 Benefits Enrollment Guide has gone green! Printed copies will not be distributed; instead you can access the electronic version on the District's **Benefits Intranet page** or as an attachment to the all-staff email that was sent the morning of Oct 21.

Please note that even if you want to keep the exact same plan you had in 2020, you must still participate in Open Enrollment. Same for those who do not want to enroll in medical coverage — you must log into Munis Self-Service by Nov. 10 to waive coverage for 2021 or elect a health plan.

For those with questions, the **virtual benefits counselor Alex** is available 24/7 from any computer or mobile device.

### **Call to Committee**

## **MLK Food Drive**
