Dual Language Parent Academy to Feature Two Special Guests

The Dual Language Parent Academy is Saturday, Nov. 9, and this event, designed to empower families to support their students' language development and academics, will also feature two inspiring special guests!

The keynote speaker will be Sylvia Acevedo, a former NASA rocket scientist who is now the CEO of the Girl Scouts of the USA. Ms. Acevedo



(pictured to the right) has been recognized widely for her accomplishments in

business and education, and for her work to bring more girls into the STEM pipeline.

Illinois State Superintendent of Education Dr. Carmen Ayala will be attending the Dual Language Parent Academy to observe the event, meet families and staff, and to deliver remarks. A lifelong educator, she is the first woman and first person of color to hold the state's top education post in a full-time capacity.

The event will start at Elgin High School, 1200 Maroon Drive, Elgin, on Saturday, Nov. 9 at 8:30 a.m. with a light breakfast accompanied by multicultural entertainment, followed by Ms. Acevedo's keynote speech and remarks from Dr. Ayala.

There will be a panel with parents and students, and multiple breakout sessions on topics including the Seal of Biliteracy, Dual Language at the secondary level, STEM, and socio-emotional learning. There will be activities led by Gail Borden Public Library for younger children as well.

Alumni Feature: Eric Echevarria of Elgin High School

It was the late 1990s, and Eric Echevarria, fresh off a four-year stint in the Marine Corps, was back in his hometown of Elgin, working at a packaging company and, in his free time, working out at the gym. There, he met a couple of guys who were Elgin police officers, and they encouraged the young veteran to consider a law enforcement career.



"I had never even thought about it," said Echevarria. But that conversation sparked what has been a notable 20-year career at EPD for Echevarria, who is the lieutenant and watch commander in charge of the department's afternoon shift. He directs four sergeants, 31 officers, and four community service officers responsible for maintaining Elgin's public safety.

Echevarria grew up on Elgin's east side, the son of Puerto Rican parents who worked hard and expected the same from their children. As a kid, Echevarria attended Illinois Park School and Channing Elementary, and then Ellis Middle School before enrolling at Elgin High School.
