FROM THE DEAN'S OFFICE

ATTENTION JUNIORS & SENIORS

As we prepare for extracurricular activities such as Prom and Senior Boat Trip, we want to ensure that our expectations of achieving high academic marks and regular school attendance are viewed as a priority. As such, students will be expected to adhere to the following expectations in order to participate in these privileged activities:

- All students must be passing five academic courses at the time of sales and through the prom and boat trip dates.
 - Students not passing five academic courses may be placed on a contract with the expectation that no failing grades are present on the day of the activity. If a course failure exists on the day, the student will not be allowed to attend and will receive a refund.
- All students must maintain a 90% attendance rate for 2nd semester,
 - 8 full days of unexcused absences or 64 single period absences
 - Attendance office can not go back to multiple months to excuse absences
 - Attendance office can only go back to the last 72 hours to excuse absences
- During the 4th quarter, a student may not receive an out-of-school suspension consequence,
- A student may not be on the loss of privilege list

ATTENTION SENIORS

Senior Assassin is not a school sanctioned event. Any student partaking in the senior assassin game on school property including athletic fields, parking lot and in the school building, will be issued appropriate consequences.

DELIVERIES TO THE SCHOOL

STUDENT PARKING REMINDERS

*Please have your parking tag hanging in your rear-view mirror facing out.

Tags should not be laying on your dash.

*Parking tag numbers should be facing out so the number is visible.

SCHOOL ID's

Students must wear their ID's around their necks at all times.

Any student that does not have their ID, must stop by the Dean's office before or after school or during your lunch period to pick up an ID. All students must show their school ID in order to receive a school lunch or breakfast. If you forget your ID, please see the Dean's office prior to your lunch period to receive a new ID. Thank you.

ATTENDANCE UPDATES

EVERY MINUTE MATTERS

Due to District Policy we are only able to clear attendance discrepancies within 72 hours of the occurrence.

ALL DAY ABSENCE & LATE ARRIVAL

(Please allow us 24 hours to update student attendance)

Call the attendance line at 847-289-3760 ext 3365 (this is a 24-hour line.)

Be sure to provide your name, student's name & school id number, relationship to student, reason for absence or late arrival and your contact number.

LATE ARRIVAL

Students must report to the Attendance window upon arrival to scan in, this includes when they arrive during a passing period. They will then receive a pass to class.

Accepted Causes of Absences

- **Illness (including mental or behavioral health)**
- **Exclusion related to an infectious disease as mandated by IDPH**
- **Observance of a religious holiday**
- **Death in the immediate family**
- **Family emergency-include nature of the emergency**
- **Circumstances that cause reasonable concern to the parent or guardian for the safety or health of the student. The reasonableness of the concern shall be subject to evaluation by the principal or principal's designee, on a case-by-case basis.**

Excused absences are those with a valid cause and which have been reported to the school by a parent or guardian. **Unexcused absences** are absences for which there is no legitimate cause.

Please note: due to the daily high volume of calls, not all calls can be answered, please leave a voice message.

Early Release

Call the early release line at 847-289-3760 ext 3764 (this is a 24-hour line.) Be sure to provide your name, your contact number, student's name & school id number, relationship to student, reason for the early release and exact time of release. You must provide at least 2 hours notice from when your student will be leaving. Passes are typically delivered at the beginning of each period. Your student signs out at the attendance window to prevent any attendance issues. All students, leaving early will exit using the main door(#1) which is located near the security desk.

If you are returning to school (same day) you will need to sign in and out at the attendance window. When signing out, your student will need to get their hand stamped to be able to return back to school.

Early Release pass- Is a copy of their class schedule that will be stamped to have them "Report to Attendance ", with the time they are to leave and date.

Please keep in mind we are a closed campus school. Any student leaving during their lunch period for a medical appointment should provide a doctor's note.

School Emergency

During any school emergencies such as a threat to the school, fire alarm, or a hold in place, please know that no calls will be answered and no students are allowed to leave until the situation has been resolved. Keeping the students safe is our top priority.

Single Class Absence

If your student has a single class absence, please have them talk with their teacher to get this resolved. The attendance office will not be able to clear these absences without the teacher's approval.

Note: If your student has a substitute teacher in their class, please ensure they listen intently during attendance. The substitute will call the student by their legal name that is listed in Infinite Campus. If your student arrives late (after attendance is taken) they will need to check in with the teacher or substitute teacher, to avoid being marked absent.

Extended School Day Absences

Pre-Approved Absence Request forms (3 or more days), are located in the attendance office, must be completed and returned at least 2 days prior to their request. Parents are discouraged from taking vacation during the school year, except during regularly scheduled breaks in the school calendar, such as winter break, spring break, and summer vacation. If an extended absence/vacation during the school year is unavoidable, the absence is marked as unexcused no matter the reason.
