Overview of the Naming Process

- U-46 **received nominations** (November 20th)
- Criteria for nominations after a person:
 - Living persons can't be considered.
 - A significant contribution to society.
 - Lends prestige & status to an institution of learning.
 - Presented in a brief statement: a. Biographical data, b. The significant contribution, c. A statement of why a school should be named after the person.



Overview of the Naming Process Contd.

- Town Hall Meeting: Today!
- Written Comments: 24 hours after the session.
- A **summary** of the public comments shared with the Superintendent for her review.
- The Board to review the nominations & the public comments on January 13th with vote to approve on January 27th.
- Name changes in August 2025.
- The Board may at its discretion name portions of a building for persons of prominence whether living or dead.

HONORING THE LEGACY OF HAWK HOLLOW

- Resonates with former students, parents & teachers.
- Symbolizes a shared legacy
 & identity (20 years of history and contributions)

CONTINUITY & STABILITY

- Many transitions: relocations & school closures due to COVID-19.
- Retaining the name offers stability and familiarity.





HISTORICAL PRECEDENT & INCLUSIVITY

- Retaining names during transitions is important, as exemplified by Eastview.
- Naming after one individual may unintentionally exclude or offend others.

COMMUNITY PRIDE & POSITIVITY

- Fosters happiness, pride & a sense of belonging.
- Unites the community through a name that reflects shared experiences & cherished memories.



CONSISTENCY AND COMMUNITY IDENTITY

- Aligns with the existing schools in the area, Bartlett Elementary and Bartlett High School.
- Create consistency, build a stronger connection to the Bartlett community.
- Easier for **families & students** to identify the school as part of the broader educational pathway in Bartlett.



1. INSPIRATION THROUGH LEADERSHIP:

- The **first Jewish woman** to serve in the U.S. Supreme Court.
- A model of perseverance, intellect & dedication to justice.

2. EMPOWERING ALL STUDENTS:

- **Lifelong advocate** for equality & fairness provides a strong example for students.
- Inspires a commitment to values like **equity**, **inclusion**, & **resilience** within the school community.

• The first village **president** of Bartlett

2. ALFT MIDDLE SCHOOL

 A former Economics teacher at Elgin High School, author, historian, community leader & philanthropist.

- Inspires children to become more involved in the STEM programs
