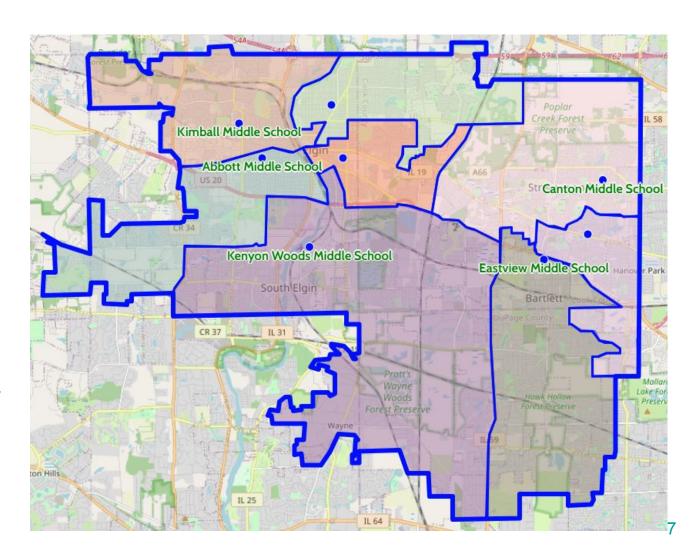

  - Additions to Kimball, Kenyon Woods
  - Construction of a new middle school in Elgin
- Board of Education will receive recommendations on elementary schools on December 18

68% of our elementary schools were built prior to 1980

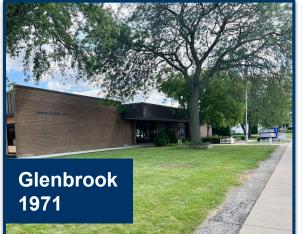

# Costs And Other Considerations With Maintaining An Elementary School



- Operational costs approximately \$100,000 per year
  - Utilities, Groundskeeping, Snow Removal, etc.
- Periodic major maintenance events approximately \$1,000,000 per year (on average)
  - Roof replacement, Boiler, HVAC, parking lot paving, etc.
- Staffing considerations approximately \$700,000 per year
  - Principal, Assistant Principal, Secretary, Custodian, etc.

U-46 spends an average of \$2M per building on maintenance each year\*

# Focus On What's Right For Our Students



#### **Appropriate Class Sizes and Staffing**

 Rebalance class sizes and staffing to provide the best opportunities for students.

#### **Grade Level Sections**

- Multiple sections of grade levels
  - Provide additional opportunities
  - Support social development
- Reduce multi-grade classrooms



Provide more students the opportunity to attend updated schools

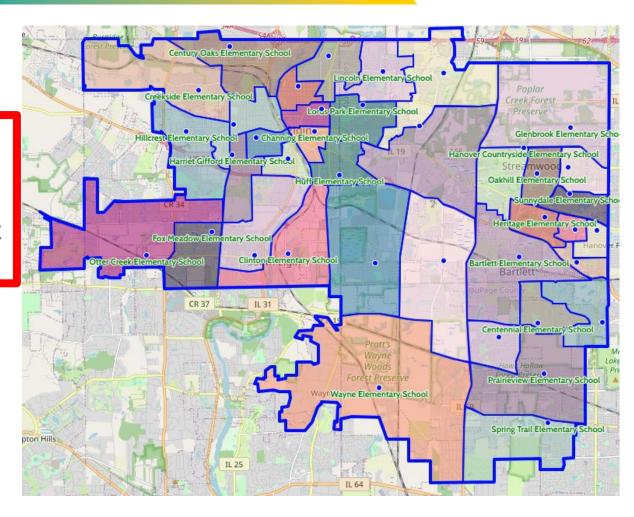

# **Next Steps In The Process**

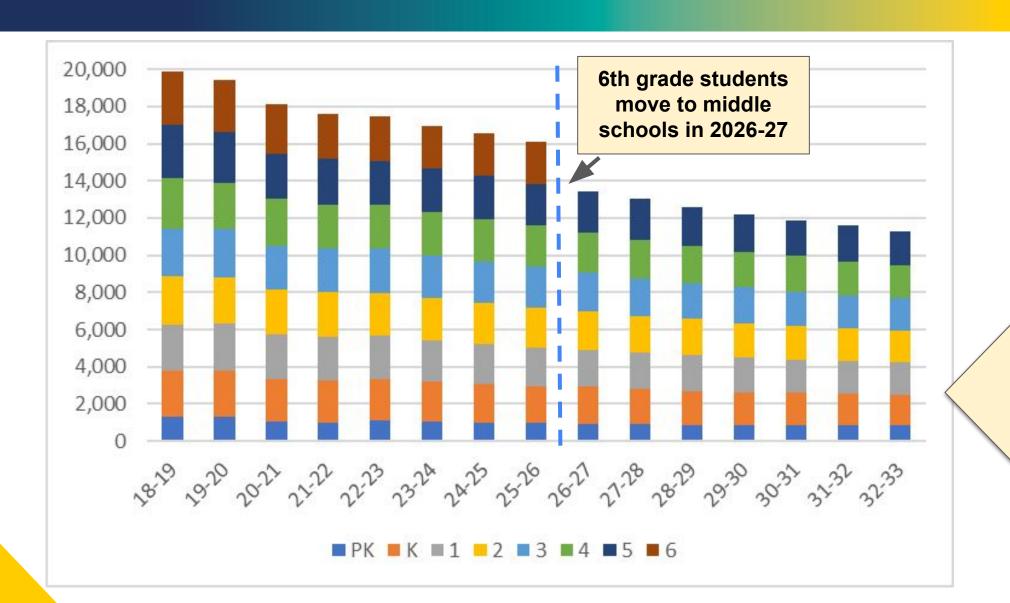


- Complete audit of elementary buildings
- Determine number of elementary schools needed
  - Considering declining enrollments and shift of 6th grade to middle school
- Provide recommendations to the Board of Education
  - Buildings to renovate, replace, or retire
- Evaluate criteria to address attendance boundaries



# **Elementary Enrollment Trend**

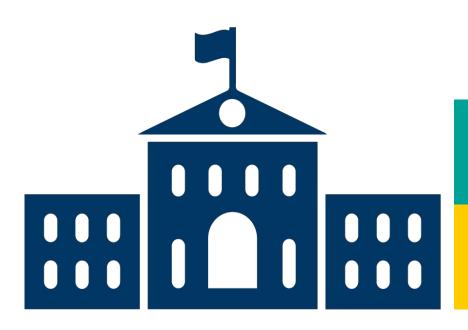




40% fewer students in our elementary schools

# **Typical Elementary Enrollment**



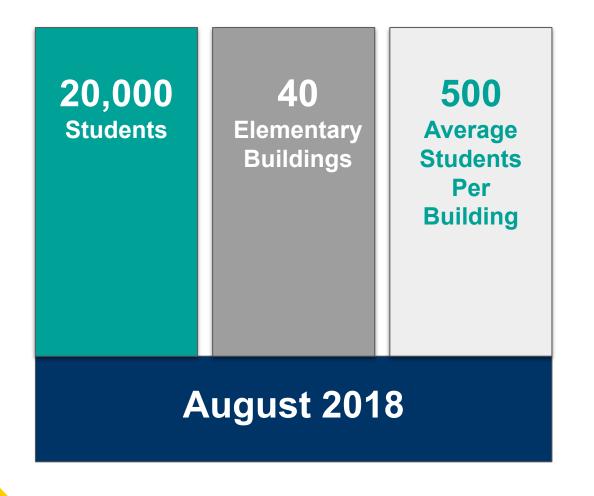


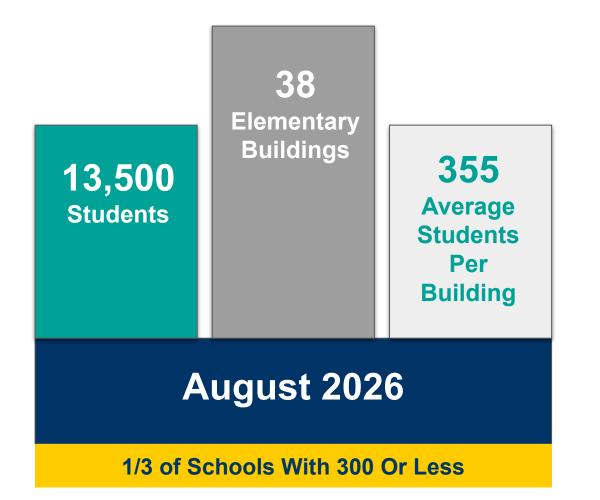
Illinois Evidence Based Funding Formula 450 Students

### Impact of Declining Enrollments in U-46



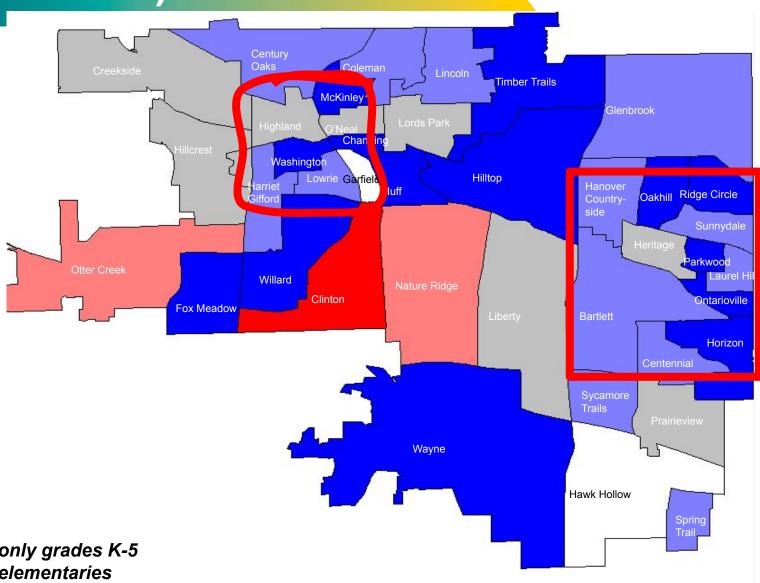




# **Projected Capacity Utilization of Elementary Schools (2026-27)**

99-113%	1



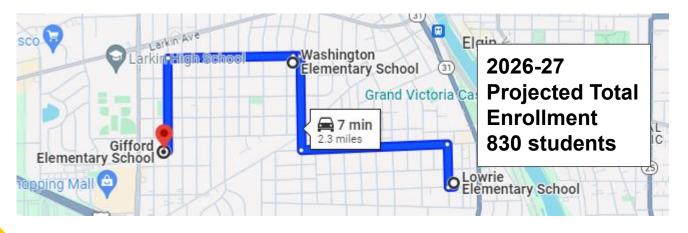

- Lowrie, Washington, Harriet Gifford
- Parkwood, Laurel Hill, Ontarioville





### **Moving Forward**

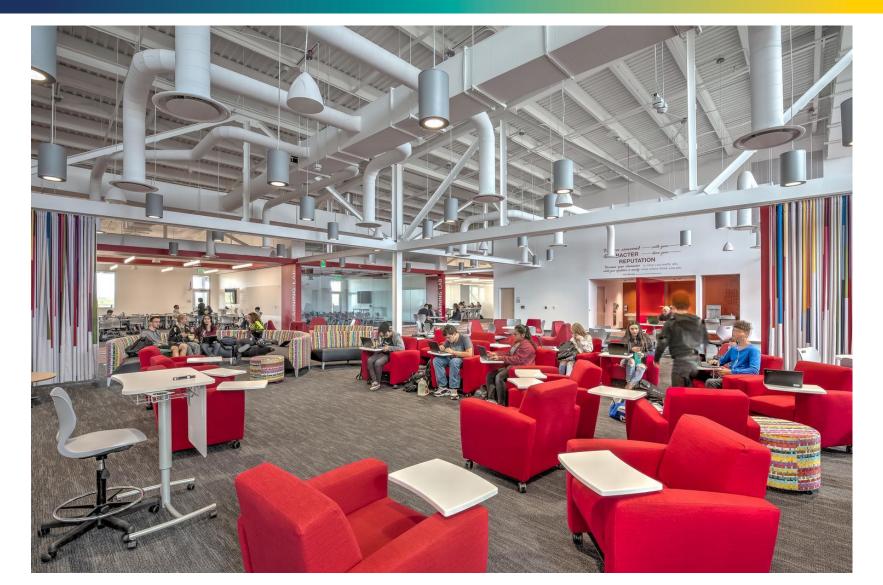


- If U-46 does not close any additional elementary schools, we will have over ⅓ of our schools running below 300 students in 2026 due to declining enrollments and 6th grade moving to middle school
- Will be presenting recommendations to the Board of Education on December 18 that will include <u>retiring an additional 3-5</u> <u>elementary schools</u>

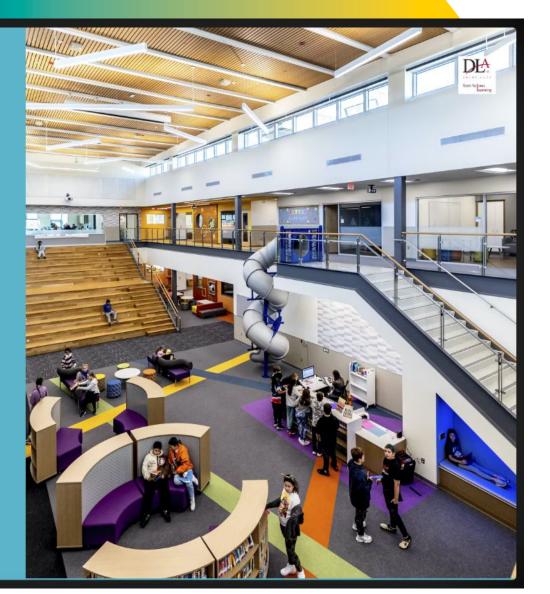
