

- ☐ Time to read
- Speaking in different contexts

- ☐ Structure your child(ren)'s day with daily chores/activities

- Use a rich and varied vocabulary in your home language














# USING INSPIRING STORIES TO ENGAGE YOUR CHILD IN OPEN-ENDED CONVERSATIONS

- Read and talk about inspiring people
- Ask reflective and thought-provoking questions: "What makes these persons/figures special?"









# **USE CREATIVITY TO DEVELOP LANGUAGE**

- Use their five senses and feelings to write a poem together
- ☐ Turn the poem into an art project
- ☐ Have a two-way conversation about a piece of art











- Tell me about your art project:
  - -What does it remind you of?
  - -How does it make you feel?
  - -Why do you feel that way?
  - -What does it smell/look/feel/taste like?
  - -Why did you choose that theme?







### **EXPLORING WITH BOOKS**

- Discover your children's interests through books
- Explore and talk about different types of careers
- Use community resources to access literature and hands-on activities









# **EXPLORING WITH BOOKS**

Read aloud a story and create your own

Role-play - using puppets

Invite your child to retell the story or favorite part using his/her own words

Play "Simon Says" mimicking characters'

actions from the story

- ☐ Encourage your child to create, read, or write a script
- Interview someone in your family and create a presentation
- Use an imaginary microphone and role-play as a reporter for a TV or radio station

- Encourage your child(ren) to sort and describe items








