





- Students who read during the summer will return to school with a few new words or good stories, and improved reading habits, too.



 - This is our traditional day camp. Students will participate in activities such as games, sports, crafts, swimming, weekly field trips, and more.
 - 6/7-8/13, M-F, 7 a.m. - 6 p.m.
 - Fee: Res \$200/NR \$225 per week
 - (Ages 5-12)
 - **Sports Camp at Wing Park**
 - Ages 6-12
 - This camp will give your child the chance to interact with their peers and learn the skills of multiple sports and games throughout the summer.
 - 6/7-8/13, M-F, 7 a.m. - 6 p.m.
 - Fee: Res \$200/NR \$225 per week

- More Programs
 - **Snapology Camps**
 - (Ages 5-14)
 - Under guided instructional and free-building time, children build various models using LEGO® bricks. Classes are limited to 10 students.
 - 2 p.m. - 5 p.m.
 - Fee: Varies based on program (\$125-\$150)
 - **Elgin Youth Choir Camp**
 - (Ages 8-17)
 - Campers participate in a week long experience where they can grow musically in a fun and exciting environment and a live performance at the end.
 - 7/19 - 7/23, M-F, 9 a.m. - 12 p.m.
 - Fee: Res \$100/NR \$125

Clinical Services

Outpatient Family Therapy

- Family Therapy is offered to help families function for the benefit of all members
- Services are comprehensive and utilize the natural strengths and resiliency of each family member to function optimally
- Available to families in the Township with youth under the age of 19
- Fees are set on a sliding scale, private insurance may reimburse costs of therapy
- Services are provided in English and Spanish
- Psychiatric services are also available through a Hanover Township Mental Health Board grant

School Based Groups

- Increase participants' positive connections to school, family, and community to ensure success
- Offer academic support
- Provide pro-social behavior support
- Build positive relationships



Prevention Services

Open Gym Program

- After school programming in nine elementary schools for ages 5-14
- Summer, winter, and spring break programming offered for ages 5-18
- Field Trip Fridays - Unique experiences, educational, and fun
- Recreational, social, and educational activities

Substance Abuse Prevention Services

- Classroom based prevention and interventions to help students develop substance refusal skills
- School based prevention groups in grades 3-12
- Community Education Forums
- Referrals to local and regional treatment facilities for families seeking assistance

Alternative to Suspension Program

- School based programming offered at elementary, middle, and high schools
- Significantly reduce discipline referrals and school suspensions
- Recent participants had an 100% graduation rate
- Provides social, academic, and behavioral support
- Develop coping skills and accountability
- Provides service learning field trips to develop leadership and team building skills
- Summer Alternatives offered to participants





