

## **Important Terms**

- <u>Required/Core Class</u> A class you have to take and pass to be able to graduate.
- <u>Elective</u> A course you choose because of your personal or career interests.
- Honors Advanced curriculum.
- Advanced Placement (AP) Courses with college-level curriculum and the potential to earn college credit through tests at the end of the course.

## **Graduation Requirements**

8 credits in English Language Arts

6 credits in Mathematics

4 credits in Sciences

(2 Physical Science; 2 Biology)

1 credit in Health

7 credits in Physical Education

2 credits in U.S. History

1 credit in Economics

1 credit in Civics

Students receive one credit per semester for each course successfully completed.

## Graduation vs. College Requirements

For **highly competitive colleges** we suggest 4 years in each of the curricular areas of English, Mathematics, Science, Social Studies, and Foreign Language.
