# K-2 RETURN TO SCHOOL

## K-2 Policies and Procedures

Attached to this email correspondence are the policies and procedures for the reopening of school. It is imperative that you familiarize yourself with our new procedures to ensure everyone's safety!

### **Math and Literacy Interventions**

Towards the end of September teachers sent home letters to parents to provide information about their child engaging in interventions. The cycle began shortly after letters went home and will be closing on November 13<sup>th</sup>. Teachers will review data from IStation, STMath, &/or BlueStreak to determine if a child should continue in interventions. If the teacher deems it necessary then the child will continue with interventions when the second cycle begins on November 30<sup>th</sup>. Our MTSS team will work in conjunction with teachers to ensure we are monitoring and providing students with the supports they need.

## **October is Bullying Prevention Month**

**October 19th** - *Let Your Kindness Shine* - Teachers will share a short video on bullying and students will share ways they plan to stand up to bullies.

**October 20th** - *The Language of Kindness* - Learn how to say hello to a friend in another language

# Hybrid/Small School Schedule

School District U-46 has been working diligently to prepare for the return of our students. We understand there are a lot of questions about the days your children will be attending school. I will do my best to clear up your questions, however, I am ALWAYS available via phone or email to provide any individual support regarding our reopening plans.

**Mondays** - All students will learn from their home and engage with teachers via their device.

<u>Tuesdays/Wednesdays</u> – Hybrid Group A will be in person at HH while Hybrid Group B and Remote Students (Group C) will be learning from home. <u>Thursdays/Fridays</u> – Hybrid Group B will be in person at HH while Hybrid Group A and Remote Students (Group C) will be learning from home.

The district has determined schedules for students based on several factors. Days for instruction will be set based on those factors which means it is unlikely families will be able to adjust the days their child/ren attend school.
