PBIS Skill Focus

February 25th – Students at Hawk Hollow will show they are safe by safety keeping their hands and feet to themselves, playing appropriately with their peers safe play on playground, and making sure to walk while going to and from recess or lunch.

March 4th - Students at Hawk Hollow show they are safe by recognizing personal space bubbles. A space bubble is an imaginary bubble around your body that can't be popped. We encourage students to remind others of their space bubble when someone is getting too close.

School Notes

At Hawk Hollow conflicts may arise with students and their peers. We have used a system to teach students how to deal with such conflict and it is called SWAP (Stop, Walk Away, and Problem Solve). When we are talking with students about the conflict they have with peers we often refer back to this system. The first week of March we will be presenting this Cool Tool to your children once again. This Cool Tool lesson was used last year and earlier this school year. I have attached the video here so you can see what we are teaching your children.

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CoGat Testing

On March 8th, District U-46 second grade students will participate in the Gifted universal screening process. We will be administering the Cognitive Abilities Test 7 (CogAT 7) during the school day.

Only the CogAT will take place in March. The identification process for the elementary program will be completed in the Fall of 2019. At that time each child's comprehensive student profile will be evaluated by the District U-46 Gifted Identification Committee. The committee will identify students who are in need of gifted and talented services. Decisions and CogAT scores will be mailed to all parents in the Fall of 2019. Students identified for Gifted Services will begin the program in fourth grade.
