Principal Notes

Conflict among children is typical and often times the conflict ends as soon as it begins. Since we are all fully aware of this, we wanted to share with you the different ways in which we teach students to problem solve.

In fifth grade our students participate in the DARE program. This program teaches social emotional learning standards including self-awareness and management, responsible decision making, understanding others, relationship and communication skills, and handling responsibilities and challenges. In 6th grade we had two officers come in to discuss bullying. Bullying is defined in the Student Code of Conduct and specific guidelines are set up on how to identify and handle such accusations. SWAP stands for Stop, Walk Away, and Problem Solve. These are the skills were are asking students to use when dealing with conflict with their peers.
