Some new changes this year that you should be aware of:

- Kindergarten students line up on the playground in the morning with the rest of the community.
- Pick up schedules should be communicated with the classroom teacher.
- Any changes to your da'ly sandale should be communicated with the teacher prior to lunch that day. The office can be notified affer lunch of any changes.
- Car rider pick up will require a tag for your car and your child's backpack. This is done to ensure safety for your children and others.
- Remeniber to stoy in your car, We can help your children with the door.
- Also, please do not park on Jacaranda and walk your children across the street and parking lot.
 We have your safety and the safety of your children at the forefront of minds when making this request.

Please be aware of coyotes in the area. It has been reported that one was seen on Gerber road near Jacaranda last week. Here are some helpful hints in case a coyote comes across your path.

- Be as big and loud as possible. Do not run or turn your back. Wave your arms, clap your hands, and shout in an authoritative voice.
- Make noise by using a whistle or air horn.
- Throw small stones, sticks, tennis balls or anything else you can find. Remember the intent is to scare and not injure the animal.
- Shake or throw a "coyote shaker" a soda can filled with pennies or pebbles and sealed with duct
