

Food Distribution

The Food & Nutrition Services department has distributed nearly 2 million meals at school sites across our District during the COVID-19 crisis. Distribution of breakfast and lunch meals, at multiple school sites, will continue for students in U-46 during Distance Learning.

To pick up their meals, families will need to show a *unique household barcode sent in email OR students full name*. The barcode can be printed at home, saved on a mobile phone, or printed at the food site. The meals can be picked up by the parent, a sitter, relative or neighbor as long as the barcode/student name is provided. Service is Monday thru

Friday from 7:00am until 10:30am. Locations listed below. Meals can be picked up at any location, does not have to be your assigned school, allowing families to pick up for all students at one location.

The meals will be available to all U-46 students, who will pay on a sliding scale. Those who qualify for free meals when school is in session will receive the meals for free, while those who qualify for reduced meals might pay 30 cents for a breakfast, for instance.

Distribución de comida

El departamento de Servicios de Alimentos y Nutrición ha distribuido casi 2 millones de comidas en las escuelas de nuestro Distrito durante la crisis de COVID-19. La distribución de desayunos y almuerzos, en varios sitios escolares, continuará para los estudiantes de U-46 durante el Aprendizaje a Distancia.

Para recoger sus comidas, las familias deberán mostrar el código de barras único del hogar enviado por correo electrónico O el nombre completo del estudiante. El código de barras se puede imprimir en casa, guardar en un teléfono móvil o imprimir en el sitio de alimentos. Los padres, un cuidador, pariente o vecino pueden recoger las comidas siempre que se proporcione el código de barras / nombre del estudiante. El servicio es de lunes a viernes de 7:00 a.m. a 10:30 a.m. En las ubicaciones listadas a continuación. Las comidas se pueden recoger en cualquier locación, no tiene que ser su escuela asignada, lo que permite a las familias recoger para todos los estudiantes en un solo lugar.

Las comidas estarán disponibles para todos los estudiantes U-46, quienes pagarán en una escala diferente. Por ejemplo, aquellos que califiquen para comidas gratis cuando la escuela esté en sesión recibirán las comidas gratis, mientras que aquellos que califiquen para comidas reducidas podrían pagar 30 centavos por un desayuno.




