Nurse Notes

It is our goal to maintain the health of all our students. There are two

important factors to consider when deciding to keep your child home

- If your child has symptoms such as fever, nausea, rash, watery eyes, severe cough or headache, he/she should remain at home until the symptoms subside and/or medical treatment has begun.
- Oral temperature of 100 degrees or above is sufficient to keep a child at home. He/she must be fever free for at least 24 hours, without medication, before returning to school.
- <u>If your child vomits or has two or more episodes of loose stool,</u> <u>he/she should remain at home for at least 24 hours free of vomiting</u> <u>or diarrhea before returning to school.</u>
 - Do not send a student with a rash to school until the rash and its seriousness has been established. A doctor can identify the cause of a rash, if any treatment is needed and if your child is contagious. Please bring a note for the doctor when your child returns to school.
- Children may attend school when they have a cold or sore throat, however, they must be free of fever and hacking cough.
- If your child has been diagnosed with Strep Throat, Scarlet Fever, or Conjunctivitis (Pink Eye), inform the school nurse. The student may return to school after 24 hours of treatment with antibiotics and if free of fever.
- When leaving message on attendance line regarding your student's absence, please state what the student's symptoms are (fever, sore throat, cough, etc...).
- If your student is out more than three days a doctor's note is suggested when he/she returns to school. If we do not have a note

🚽 from the doctor the absences will be marked unexcused.

Welcome to Hawk Hollow Library

Dear Parents,

The library officially opened for classes on Monday August 27th. During the first week I reviewed library expectations and procedures. I would like to take a few minutes to let you know what will be expected of the students this year.

<u>Your Student's Library Day:</u> Monday - Benson, Cardiff/A Tuesday - French, Liner, Welu/B Wednesday - Dyer, Dusek, Doherty, Lackowski Thursday - Kubiak, Mastroianni, Schroeder, Henderson Friday - Ryan, Ellena, Fels

Students will visit the library one day per week on the day specified above. All grades check out books from the library. Books are due back in the library the following week on their library day. It is a one week loan.

- K-1 check out 1 book each week
- 2-6 check out 2 books each week
- Please help your student keep track of their library books and help them to return the books on time.
- Students must return the books they have checked out in order to check out new books. If a book is not returned after 2 weeks I will send an email to parents with the replacement cost noted. If, after 3 weeks, the book is still not returned it will be deemed "lost" and replacement cost will be requested.
- Grades 3-6 only: If a student does not finish a book within the one week time frame, he /she may RENEW the book for one additional week. They will complete a RENEW slip and place it inside the front cover. RENEW slips are located in the classrooms.
- When library books are at home, encourage your student to follow these book care rules. Do not eat or drink while reading a book. The most frequent cause of book damage is mold/mildew caused by food/beverages. Keep library books in a designated area and keep the books out of reach of pets and younger siblings. Do not color or write in books. Always use a bookmark or piece of paper to mark where you stopped reading. Do not bend a page corner.
- If a student's book gets damaged, please do not try to fix it yourself. I have special glue, tape and cleaner for this purpose. Return the book with a note. I may be able to repair a book without having to charge you. If the book is damaged beyond repair the student will be billed for the replacement cost of the book.
- Please encourage your child to read and please read to them!
