Light Table Brings Learning to Life

Educator Marta Laskus loves "seeing the 'light bulb' go off when students are working on academic activities and learning to socialize appropriately." Laskus, a recipient of the first-ever Innovation Mini-Grant Awards, works with the Deaf and Hard-of-Hearing early childhood program at Horizon Elementary.

She applied for funds to purchase a light table and related manipulatives for her classroom. The equipment allows preschoolers to explore color and light, acquiring academic skills in a play-based manner. One unexpected benefit is that it provides sensory breaks and "enables students to calm down, focus, and self-regulate their emotions to prepare their minds to learn. The light table has been such an incredible addition to the classroom," said Laskus.

Eight winning projects were selected from 27 proposals which covered a variety of innovative programs. Elgin High's Maroon Mentoring Program received funds to supports monthly events for students dealing with traumatic life experiences. Another grant added equipment for biotechnology studies in DNA and Hereditary Study Units at Bartlett High School. Hillcrest Elementary was awarded a grant to develop a parent-child book club.

"We are excited to continue supporting innovative programs in U46 in the years ahead, and we're appreciative of all the donors who help make this happen," said Foundation Board President Bud Wilson.
