**STUDENT ID'S**

**Students are reminded that they must have their CURRENT student ID on when entering the building. Previous years IDs will not be allowed.** IDs are to be worn on a lanyard during the school day. **Attention interested juniors and seniors** - Additional parking spots for second semester are available in the Deans' Office beginning January 6th. ## School Nurse News



### **Cold and Flu season is here!**

Respiratory colds are very common this time of year. Students are not required to stay home unless they have a fever or they cannot control their cough. Using good hygiene habits are a must! Please remind your students to always cough into their elbow to avoid hand contamination and to wash their hands often. When students have a fever, they should stay home until they have been fever-free for 24 hours. Please mention the fever and other symptoms when calling the attendance line. The Kane County Health Department requires us to report the number of students with flu-like symptoms on a weekly basis during the winter months. And remember-it is not too late to get your flu vaccine!

### **Communicating with parents/guardians**

When your student comes in to the Nurse's Office with a health complaint, we often need to speak to you on the telephone. Cell phone use is not permitted in the Nurse's Office and cell reception is very spotty. One problem we have been encountering is that parents do not recognize the SEHS phone number when it comes through on their cell phones and therefore do not answer our calls. Please add the SEHS phone number to your contact list. When we do call a parent and are transferred to voicemail, we always leave a message. At this time, we are not able to send text messages from the school district phones. Please let us know if you have any questions or concerns. 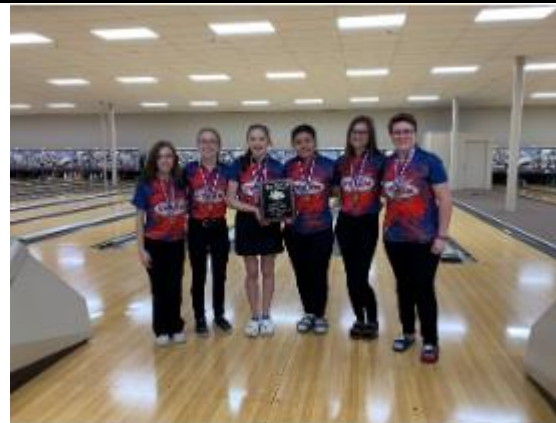
