Important Terms

- Semester One-half of the school year (18 weeks)
- <u>Credit</u> Transcript unit is earned each semester (with a passing grade (A, B, C, D). An E is not a passing grade).
- <u>GPA</u> abbreviation for "grade point average." GPA looks at all the grades you've gotten in school. It's calculated by adding all the numbered grades you've received and dividing them by the number of credits you've taken.
- <u>Transcript</u> A record of all your grades in high school.
 All your report cards combined into one!

Important Terms


- Required/Core Class A class you have to take and pass to be able to graduate
- <u>Elective</u> A course you choose because of your personal or career interests.
- Honors Advanced curriculum.
- Advanced Placement (AP) Courses with college-level curriculum and the potential to earn college credit.
- <u>Dual Credit (DC) courses</u>- College courses taken here at SHS or at ECC

More Important Terms

- Four Year Plan A high school course plan, including all the courses you need for graduation plus the elective classes that will lead to their future career field or college major.
- Post Secondary After high school
- <u>Post Secondary Plan</u> A plan of what you would like to do after completing high school, like attend college, work, or join the military.

So Let's Talk More About Earning Credits

- » Earn 40 credits to graduate while meeting the requirements
- » Earning an E does not reward you any credits
- » Earning 10 credits in required courses keeps you on track for graduation.
