Counselors help high school students make academic, career, and personal choices, but it is the parents, guardians and students who make final decisions in these crucial areas. Group guidance ses-

sions are held throughout the highs school year. Although individual student conferences are scheduled regularly, students, parents, and guardians can also request an appointment whenever they see a need.

REGISTER for AP Advanced Placement Exams	AprMay	If you have taken an AP course in the current school year - register for the AP Exam. The tests are held the first two weeks in May.
NCAA CLEARNINGHOUSE 6TH SEMESTER TRANSCRIPT	June	If you plan to play sports (div. I & II) in College, the NCAA Clearinghouse requires a 6th semester transcript and ACT/SAT scores. You must complete a <i>transcript release form</i> in the guidance office, pay your fees to the Clearinghouse and complete the NCAA online registration. The transcript will be mailed to the NCAA in early July after all final grades have been updated in the system and a 6th semester GPA is calculated. <b>www.eligibilitycenter.org</b>
