



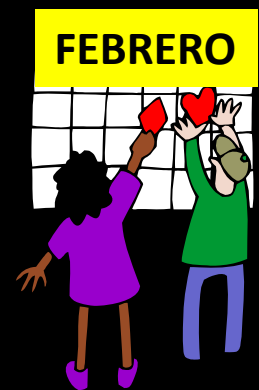

In Spanish the days of the week and the months are NOT capitalized.

1. **lunes** / Monday
2. **martes** / Tuesday
3. **miércoles** / Wednesday
4. **jueves** / Thursday
5. **viernes** / Friday
6. **sábado** / Saturday
7. **domingo** / Sunday

What two days of the week have an accent in Spanish?

- **miércoles**
- **sábado**

The days of the week are all masculine.

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**Days of the week!**

Days of the week ending in **-S** do not change form in the plural. Only the article changes.

| 3. <b>el miércoles</b> | <b>los miércoles</b> |
| 4. <b>el jueves</b>    | <b>los jueves</b>    |
| 5. <b>el viernes</b>   | <b>los viernes</b>   |
| 6. <b>el sábado</b>    | <b>los sábados</b>   |
| 7. <b>el domingo</b>   | <b>los domingos</b>  |

When used with the days of the week, the definite article has the special meaning "on".

**No trabajo el lunes.**

**No trabajo los martes.**

**Hay una fiesta el miércoles.**

**Hay muchas fiestas los viernes.**

**I don't work on Monday.**

**I don't work on Tuesdays.**

**There is a party on Wednesday.**

**There are many parties on Fridays.**
