- **Preparation** The PSAT is a practice exam to help prepare for the SAT. The SAT is used for College admission and is a graduation requirement, and it also impacts how our school is measured. ISA is aligned to the Illinois Learning Standards for Science incorporating the Next Generation Science Standards, which were adopted in 2014.
- **Opportunity** Sophomores may use their score on the PSAT in a future application to potentially participate in U-46's Dual Credit enrollment program with Elgin Community College (ECC). SAT scores are considered in admission to postsecondary institutions.
