Primary students will enter at Door #1 (main entrance of school) and stay in the inside school corridor until just before school begins at 8:30am. The Intermediate grades (3-6) students will be allowed in the building and will stay in the multi-purpose room until just before school starts.

Students who are involved in school scheduled activities will be allowed in just before their activity begins in the morning.
