
U-46 Strategic Plan

Priority 2: We will coordinate our efforts to provide a nurturing and safe learning experience and a flexible approach in meeting the academic, social, and emotional needs of each student.




5Essentials – Comparing U-46 and Illinois – Safety (Student Measure)

Security Systems

Using Safety Technology

BASCO - Building Access Security Control Office

- Electronic access control (EAC)
 - Each employee has FOB with different access ability
 - All police departments have 24/7 all door access FOBs
- Exterior door locks
 - Strict control of exterior key E-Key
- Limited access points
 - Limited to 2 7 access points
- Each with EAC, E-Key, and with camera monitoring
- The District monitors and supports:
 - Over 100 panic buttons silent alarms
 - Over 600 cameras
 - Over 2,000 handheld and base radios being utilized within the district.









Using Safety Technology

Visitor Entrances

- Exterior door locked
- Intercom system, buzz to request entry
- Camera viewable from front office
- Sign indicating visitor expectations
- When inside sign in with Raptor
 - Wear a name tag




Using Safety Technology

- Visitor management system Raptor
- Since August 2016:
 - 188,000 visitors logged in the system in two years
 - 35 private alerts entered
 - Court orders or other safety concerns
 - 34 registered sex offenders flagged

Lockdown Locks

All classrooms, offices and single staff bathrooms

Lockdown Key

- Universal to all buildings and rooms
- All staff assigned a key when hired

Staff bathrooms

- Always closed and locked
- Lockdown key used to secure the door from the inside (removal of thumb turns)





School Safety Plans



- Classroom Action Plan revised
 - Lockdown and Evacuation procedures updated and revised
- Classroom Action Map revised
 - Updated with a secondary evacuation route
- School Safety Guide Book revised
 - Green binder located in each front office
 - Future request to the Board for approval



School Safety Training Drills and Response Procedures

- 1. Evacuation Fire Revision
- 2. Severe Weather Tornado
- 3. Secure Building Situation outside the campus
- 4. Hold in Place Situation on campus
- 5. Lockdown Potential danger Revision
 - a. Immediate Action Required
 - b. Run, Hide, Fight
 - c. Law Enforcement Training Drill

Crisis Prevention Institute - CPI




58% - U-46 staff have participated in CPI training

Trauma Informed Care

- Training of Adverse Childhood Experiences
- In two years:
 - 26 school Resiliency Teams trained







- Three objectives:
 - 1. Raise the awareness of Adverse Childhood Experiences
 - 2. Grow the expertise in Trauma Informed Care
 - 3. Develop a plan to address caregiver compassion fatigue

Scenario and Exercise Training

- Hosted at a U-46 school
- School armed assailant scenario
- Elgin police and fire coordinated
 - Hundreds of police officers and firefighters participated
 - Over 100 community volunteers served as role players

Takeaways:

- Police need access to archival video
- Intercom system improvement



Next Steps:

- Complete the lockdown locks program at high schools
- Continue the work of Trauma Informed Care team
- Report to BOE regarding the camera monitoring intergovernmental agreement with Elgin Police
 - Request for expansion of archival capabilities
- Strengthen the staff, student and parent/guardian participation in the Student Code of Conduct
