The winner of our School Spelling Bee will compete in the Kane County Semi-Final Spelling Bee in Aurora in February. The top four spellers from the Semi-Final Spelling Bee advance to the Final Bee in March.

First and second grade classes may choose to compete in classroom Spelling Bees, and possibly in a grade-level Bee sometime later this year, but will not compete in the School Spelling Bee against the older students.

Your child's teacher will distribute grade-level spelling lists to study for the classroom Spelling Bee. If your child is looking for a challenge, they may also study the 2016 School Spelling Bee Study List to prepare for the School Spelling Bee.

Please encourage your child to prepare for this fun event by studying the words at home over time. We are looking forward to this academic competition! Good luck to all the competitors!
