


December 18, 2023 Update for Board of Education

Elementary schools identified to be rebuilt, renovated, or retired through Unite U-46


























Themes identified during Elementary School Visits











Costs And Other Considerations With Maintaining An Elementary School



- Operational costs approximately \$100,000 per year
 - Utilities, Groundskeeping, Snow Removal, etc.
- Periodic major maintenance events approximately \$1,000,000 per year (on average)
 - Roof replacement, Boiler, HVAC, parking lot paving, etc.
- Staffing considerations approximately \$700,000 per year
 - Principal, Assistant Principal, Secretary, Custodian, etc.

U-46 spends an average of \$2M per building on maintenance each year*

Appropriate Class Sizes and Staffing

 Rebalance class sizes and staffing to provide the best opportunities for students.

Grade Level Sections

- Multiple sections of grade levels
 - Provide additional opportunities
 - Support social development
- Reduce multi-grade classrooms




Provide more students the opportunity to attend updated schools

Next Steps In The Process




- Complete audit of elementary buildings
- Determine number of elementary schools needed
 - Considering declining enrollments and shift of 6th grade to middle school
- Provide recommendations to the Board of Education
 - Buildings to renovate, rebuild, or retire
- Evaluate criteria to address attendance boundaries



Elementary Enrollment Trend






40% fewer students in our elementary schools

Typical Elementary Enrollment







Illinois Evidence Based Funding Formula 450 Students

Impact of Declining Enrollments in U-46








Projected Capacity Utilization of Elementary Schools (2026-27)




Determining The Number Of Elementary Schools Needed

- Parkwood, Laurel Hill, Ontarioville






Moving Forward



■ If U-46 does not close any additional elementary schools, we will have over ½ of our schools running below 300 students in 2026 due to declining enrollments and 6th grade moving to middle school





Recommendations

McKinley Elementary 258 Lovell Street, Elgin



- Built 1887
- Only 2.4 acres of land
- Identified by Unite U-46 Committee to be rebuilt
- Scored "C" by DLR Group
 - Accessibility concerns
- Current enrollment in 23-24 (K-6): 353
- Recommendation: Rebuild, location TBD



Century Oaks Elementary 1235 Braeburn Drive, Elgin






- Built 1970
- Identified by Unite U-46 Committee to be rebuilt
- Scored "C-" by DLR Group
- Current enrollment in 23-24 (K-6): 427
- Sits on ~8 acres, so may be possible to rebuild new school on site
- Recommendation: Retire, transition plan TBD

Illinois Park Early Childhood Center 1350 Wing Street, Elgin





- Built in 1999
- Identified by Unite U-46 Committee to eventually be closed
 - Only after adding PreK sections to many of our elementary schools
- Received a "B-" from DLR Group
- Drop-off and pick-up not ideal due to heavy traffic
- Sits on ~8 acres
- Recommendation: Retire as Early Childhood Center, conduct feasibility study

Washington Elementary 819 W. Chicago Street, Elgin






- Built in 1893
- Identified by Unite U-46
 Committee for addition or renovation
- Scored "C" by DLR Group
- Enrollment in 23-24 (K-6): 380
- Sits on only 2.4 acres, so addition options are limited
- Recommendation: Retire

Lowrie Elementary 264 Oak Street, Elgin





- Built in 1887
- 1.95 acres
- Identified by Unite U-46 Committee to be rebuilt
- Scored "C" by DLR Group
- Enrollment in 23-24 (K-6): 333
- Recommendation: Retire

Parkwood Elementary 2150 Laurel Avenue, Hanover Park





- Built 1971
- Identified by Unite U-46 Committee to be rebuilt
 - Ineffective layout with connected rooms
- Lot size 7.4 acres
- Scored "B" by DLR Group
- Current enrollment in 23-24 (K-6): 280
- Recommendation: No rebuild, monitor enrollment data for possible consolidation

Glenbrook Elementary 315 Garden Circle, Streamwood





- Built 1971
- Identified by Unite U-46 Committee to be rebuilt
- Scored "C-" by DLR Group
- Enrollment in 23-24 (K-6): 459
- Sits on ~6 acres, so may be possible to rebuild new school on site
 - Drainage concerns on property may be limiting
- Recommendation: Rebuild, location TBD

Hanover Countryside Elementary 6 S. Bartlett Road, Streamwood





- Built 1954
- Lot size of 4.4 acres
- Recommended for closure by Unite U-46 Committee
- Scored "C-" by DLR Group
- Enrollment in 23-24 (K-6): 370
- Recommendation: Maintain as possible transition space, then retire

Highland Elementary 190 N. Melrose Ave, Elgin





- Built 1959
 - ▶ 3 additions, latest 2016
- Lot size of 6.5 acres
- Almost 63,000 sq ft
- Scored "C" by DLR Group
- Enrollment in 23-24 (K-6): 568
- Recommendation: Consider for updates/addition

Harriet Gifford Elementary 240 South Clifton Ave, Elgin





- Built 1948
 - ▶ 3 additions, latest 2002
- Lot size of 3.6 acres
- Scored "C-" by DLR Group
- Enrollment in 23-24 (K-6): 386
- Recommendation: Consider for updates/addition

Summary of Recommendations



Pre-K and Elementary Sites will be impacted as follows:

- Lowrie, McKinley, and Washington will be retired in June 2027
- Century Oaks, Hanover Countryside and Glenbrook will be retired at a future date to be determined
- A new elementary school will be built in northeast Elgin
- A new elementary school will be built for the Streamwood/Hanover Park area
- Conduct feasibility study to convert Illinois Park to an elementary school
- Parkwood will be monitored for possible consolidation at a later date
- Additions and renovations will be considered for Harriet Gifford and Highland

Elementary boundaries will be revised and communicated in the Fall of 2024
