Attendance Office

- 1. If your student will be absent all day or late to school, please contact the attendance office at 847-289-3760, option 2 or extension **3365** to report the absence or late arrival.
- 2. If there is a conflict with your student being marked absent for one period, please have your student contact that teacher for the correction.
- 3. Students are not allowed to excuse their absences.
- 4. For early release, please call 847-289-3760, option 3 or extension **3764**. We would appreciate notification at least one hour prior to the release time.
- 5. Please allow 24 hours for changes to be updated in Infinite Campus.
- 6. If your student is coming in late or leaving early, they must scan in/out at the Attendance office or their absence will be unexcused.

SEHS PARKING LOT TRAFFIC FLOW INFORMATION

Please <u>click here</u> to access the traffic pattern that will need to be followed starting Tuesday, August 13 for those students being dropped off, driving to school or being picked up at school.

Please know that there is minimal traffic between 7:00 am – 7:25 am so it would be helpful to arrive early to avoid congestion.

The West parking lot (adjacent to the auditorium) is dedicated to buses. Driving through this parking lot, or attempting to drop off/pick up students in this area creates a safety hazard. Please support us by avoiding this area when picking/dropping up your student. Thank you for your help.

As a reminder, all students being dropped off, driving to school, or walking must enter through Door #1 by the flag pole. Bus riders will enter through Door #24 in the back of the building.

Student Services

Meetings

• Parents and students have the right to participate in IEP meetings & 504 meetings in person, via telephone, or virtually. Our invitations will be sent to come to the Guidance Office, but just let us know if you need to attend a different way.

Testing

- All 9th, 10th, and 11th grade students participate in College Board testing in the Fall. If your student requires accommodations, you and your student need to sign the consent form and return to the Guidance Office by August 18th so the school can submit the application. *If you were previously approved for accommodations & attended SEHS, you do not need to submit a new form.*
- In the Spring, we will be participating in ACT testing. Any 11th grade student who requires accommodations will need to turn in a consent form to release information. This form can be obtained from the case manager or school counselor. It will be due in February.

Transition

• Early release days will be applicable to students in the Transition program. If you would like to pick your young adult up on these days, notify your classroom teacher. Otherwise, your young adult will have the chance to participate in an alternative activity & transportation will continue to be provided at 3:05pm.
