Greetings Storm Nation,

I cannot believe it is April already. We still have so much to do, and so much to celebrate! April and May will be busy with all kinds of exciting opportunities for our students. That being the case, it is important that we are all on the same page with expectations. We continue to strive to make sure that all of our students are in class, on time, prepared to engage in learning every day that they are able.

There has been concern in the community regarding a "senior assassin" game. Please remind your student that this game does not exist at SEHS. Look alike and toy weapons are strictly prohibited from all U46 property. Students in possession of such items will be subject to disciplinary action as identified by the student code of conduct. The South Elgin Police Department has also put out warnings for participating in this game in the community; those warnings are included later in the Friday Forecast.

My concern is for the safety of our students. What seems like an innocent game can quickly turn into a much bigger issue when students make unsafe choices. It's not worth the risk. Ask your student to participate in a more productive celebration of their senior year.

Next week is not a typical week. Monday is a normal day of school, Tuesday and Wednesday students are testing, Thursday is a teacher institute day (no school for students), and Friday is a Spring Holiday (no school). Please see our counseling section for more details regarding testing. Here are my tried and true testing tips that are helpful for all students:

- 1. Be well rested, get to bed early.
- 2. Fuel your brain, eat a good breakfast.
- 3. Leave your cell phone in your locker, car, at home, or anywhere where it won't be a distraction.
- 4. Answer all of the questions, there is no penalty for wrong answers.
- 5. Arrive on time and don't rush. This is important.


I hope all of our students are able to take this round of testing seriously and do their best.

From the Office of Climate and Culture

As we prepare for extracurricular activities such as Prom and Senior Boat Trip, we want to ensure that our expectations of achieving high academic marks and regular school attendance are viewed as a priority. As such, students will be expected to adhere to the following expectations in order to participate in these privileged activities:

All students **must be passing five academic courses** at the time of sales and through the prom and/or boat trip dates.

Students not passing five academic courses may be placed on an academic contract with their dean. The expectation is that no failing grades are present on the day of the activity. If a course failure exists on the day, the student will not be allowed to attend and will receive a refund.

All students must maintain a 90% attendance rate for 2nd semester.

Cannot have 8 full days of **unexcused** absences or 64 single period absences.

Attendance office can only go back to the last 72 hours to excuse absences.

During the 4th quarter, a student may not receive an out-of-school suspension consequence.

A student may not be on the loss of privilege list.

EARLY RELEASE DAYS

Due to the high volume of early release calls, we will not be able to accommodate calls received after 1:00 pm on early release days unless deemed an emergency.

Attendance Reminders

- 1. Single class absence or tardy that may have been entered in error can only be excused by the teacher for that period. Please email the teacher.
- 2. There is only a 72-hour window to excuse any absences.
- 3. All students MUST scan in or out, when leaving early or arriving late. Failure to do so will result in the student being marked unexcused for the periods missed.
- 4. If there is an *in-school emergency* situation, please keep in mind that no calls will be answered until the situation is resolved.

Students leaving early

- When calling your student out early, please include the <u>exact time of release</u>, your name, relation to the student, your contact number, student's name and ID number.
- Be sure to call at least 2 hours before the release time.
- Your student will receive an early release pass that will be stamped "Report to Attendance Office" with the time they are to report to the attendance office. Your student must sign out at the attendance office in order to be excused. When signing out, your student will need to get their hand stamped to be able to return back to school if applicable. All students leaving early will exit using the main door (door #1) which is located near the security desk.
- If your student is returning to school (same day) your student will need to sign back in at the attendance office before going to class.

REMINDER - FAFSA is a graduation requirement

- All seniors have to complete either the 2024-2025 FAFSA or the 2025-2026 Alternative Application for Illinois Financial Aid (in <u>English</u> or <u>Spanish</u>) for any undocumented students. Colleges will also use this document to determine what financial aid they can provide. Any student/family that does not plan on completing the FAFSA or the Alternative Application will need to "opt-out" by completing the <u>FAFSA Nonparticipation Form</u>.
- The Senior Year-End Activity and Post-Secondary Evidence is a graduation requirement. Both of these tasks can be located and completed in Schoolinks. Please follow the steps below:
- 1. Login to Schoolinks through Clever
- 2. Click on Show Remaining To Dos on dashboard
- 3. Click on Senior Year-End Activity
- 4. Click on U-46 Post Secondary Evidence Plan
- 5. Upload evidence of your post high school plans. (Examples: Housing deposit, employment offer letter, placement test results, enrollment confirmation, enlistment contract or work schedule).

ATTENTION JUNIORS

- Counselors will continue to meet with all Juniors one on one for their Jr. meeting to explore their post-secondary plans. All Juniors should continue to utilize Schoolinks as a great resource.
- Save the date! College Jumpstart is a two-day voluntary and in-person program that will be offered at Elgin High School August 4th and 5th. It will cover topics important for incoming seniors, such as developing a post-secondary plan, exploring post-secondary options, college applications, essays, letters of recommendation, financial aid, and other post-secondary resources. <u>Click here</u> for more information and to register. - In Illinois all Juniors must take the School Day ACT assessment as part of the state graduation requirement. The ACT will be offered on April 15th. Any senior who did not take the school day SAT last April must take the ACT April 15th.Though this ACT is a required state test for juniors, the resulting scores are official ACT scores that can be reported to colleges during the application process, if you choose. ATTENTION: "Senior Assassin" Game Creates Danger for Participants & Police

As the weather warms up, we're hearing reports that South Elgin High School and St. Charles North High School students are preparing to play the "Senior Assassin" game. While this game may seem like harmless fun, it creates serious safety concerns for the participants, the responding officers, and the public.

What is Senior Assassin?

Students "target" each other with water guns, often using tactics like hiding in yards, wearing masks, and chasing each other in cars to avoid elimination.



Why is this dangerous?

Public Alarm – People may mistake participants for real threats, leading to unnecessary 911 calls and police responses.

Police Response Risks – Officers responding to reports of armed individuals don't immediately know the situation is a game. What seems fun to players can quickly become a high-risk situation.

Traffic & Trespassing Violations – Players running through neighborhoods, hiding in backyards, or driving recklessly to avoid being "eliminated" put themselves and others in real danger.

Risk of Armed Citizens Reacting – In Illinois, there are individuals with concealed carry licenses (CCLs), and some may be overly eager to intervene in what they perceive as a real threat. A person carrying what looks like a weapon—even a water gun—could provoke a tragic encounter.

Possible Criminal Consequences

Participating in this game could result in serious legal consequences, including but not limited to:

Disorderly Conduct – Causing public panic or disrupting peace.

Trespassing – Entering private property without permission.

Reckless Driving – Speeding or driving dangerously while trying to escape opponents.

Aggravated Assault – Pointing a weapon (real or otherwise) causing someone to believe they are in immediate danger of being hurt with said weapon.


We encourage parents and guardians to talk to their teens about the very real risks of playing "Senior Assassin" and the legal consequences that can follow.

We also encourage the public that *if you see something, say something*. If you see suspicious activity or someone with what appears to be a weapon, CALL <u>911</u>IMMEDIATELY. Our officers will respond as if it's a real threat until we can deem it otherwise.

Let's keep our community safe and be reasonable. Avoid unnecessary risks, and choose safer ways to have fun.
