

Rationale: Odell Education

Current curriculum is outdated.

Odell Education High School Literacy Program is designed as an English Language Arts curriculum using a diverse grade-level text set while giving students choice and voice.

Students will have equal access to high-quality complex text for their grade level being given texts consumables.

Students will create and produce narrative, expository, and argumentative writing that is both responsive to readings and their own ideas.

Rationale: Pre-AP

Students will have the opportunity to engage deeply with texts, sources, and data, as well as compelling higher-order questions and problems to build skills before they enter their first AP course.

Teachers will have consistent instructional model of planning, teaching, assessing, and reflecting, providing continuity for students and teachers across all courses.

Pre-AP courses are directly back-mapped from specific AP courses and often include strong connections to other ELA AP course offerings.

Rationale: ELA AP Courses

Students will have the opportunity to enroll in English 10/AP Seminar beginning Sophomore year. This course is designed to complement other AP courses and college-readiness by using an interdisciplinary approach to develop the critical thinking, research, collaboration, time management, and presentation skills students need for college-level work.

All ELA AP teachers will use AP Classroom to ensure we have a consistent instructional model and resources for ELA AP coursework including course frameworks, pacing, instructional activities, questions, assignments, and feedback.

Rationale: ELA 4

Students who have successfully completed 3 ELA credits and have a SAT score of 480 or less will be enrolled in College Prep/Transitional English Language Arts.

All students may enroll in AP English Literature and Composition.

Students who meet the requirements for Dual Credit may enroll in that course.
