

CAC - Boundaries

The CAC E&F Committee approved a proposal which will go to the regularly scheduled CAC General Meeting on November 12th at 7pm for approval. The full draft of the report can be found by going to http://www.u46cac.org/committees/enrollment-and-facilities-committee/. The proposal is listed as "E&F Boundary Study Phase I Final Report 2015-10-20_DRAFT".

As a reminder, the monthly CAC General Meetings are open to all parents within the district.

The proposal which was approved includes the Option 1 scenario for Liberty. This option moves 107 students from Nature Ridge (Heron's Landing neighborhood) to Liberty and moves the Liberty ESL program to Praireview in Bartlett. This option eliminates the need for mobiles at Nature Ridge for general classes and provides mobile space for Nature Ridge's art & Music classes. In addition, this option frees up classroom space at Liberty.

If the proposal is approved at the CAC General Meeting, the proposal will be sent to the Board of Education in November.
