– ISBE's Weekly Message / OneGoal – U-46 partners with OneGoal to support post secondary success

June 13, 2023

The mission of School District U-46 in Elgin is to "be a great place for all students to learn, all teachers to teach, and all employees to work. All means all." With six high schools and nearly 12,000 high school students, achieving this goal of equity is no small task. The district partnered with OneGoal to advance postsecondary outcomes and to increase college and career readiness for its students.

District leaders at U-46 evaluated their postsecondary advising and preparation program and found that the percentage of students attending college was not meeting district goals. In fact, a survey of students showed that one in five disagreed that all students are encouraged to go to college. A survey of teachers found that a majority reported they did not think postsecondary was part of their work.

OneGoal has identified seven focus areas related to a district's postsecondary practices. Each district working with OneGoal selects 1-2 areas for improvement. U-46 had the opportunity to work with OneGoal through ISBE's partnership, funded by federal pandemic relief funds, and selected Continuous Improvement Cycles and Adult Capacity Building as its areas of focus.

Seeing an increase in the number of students completing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid and more students with a documented postsecondary plan have been big wins for the district. Lead Counselor Alexa Charsha-Hahn also points to a larger cultural shift in the district since it began partnering with OneGoal: "The conversations that counselors are having with students has changed, and the language we're using has helped us translate the options available to our students in really meaningful ways."

Streamwood resident Suzanne Johnson was named superintendent of School District
U-46, the state's second-largest school district.

Johnson began her career in education in <mark>U-46</mark> nearly 26 years ago, and since February she's served as the district's interim superintendent. She will officially assume the role July 1.

"The board is delighted to welcome <mark>Dr. Johnson</mark> as our new superintendent. We look forward to working with her and are excited about the future of <mark>U-46</mark>," said <mark>board</mark> President Susan Kerr.

Johnson had served for five years as <mark>U-46's deputy superintendent of instruction</mark> when the board appointed her as interim superintendent on Feb. 23, after the district's previous leader, Tony Sanders, was named state superintendent for Illinois.

A graduate of Elgin High School, Johnson, returned to her U-46 roots to teach language arts at Canton Middle School in Streamwood. Johnson's first administrative role was at Bartlett High School. She quickly advanced into the role of associate principal and then principal prior to moving into a role in central administration in 2013, first as an assistant superintendent of Teaching and Learning before being promoted to the deputy superintendent position.

Within U-46, Johnson is known for her deep understanding of instructional practices and a commitment to fostering academic excellence.

Johnson holds her undergraduate degree from the University of Iowa, her master's degree in curriculum and instruction from DePaul University, and her doctorate in curriculum and instruction from the University of Illinois-Chicago.
