- Chicago Tribune- Senior goalie Adrian Mucha makes 9 saves in return from injury as Bartlett ties Streamwood. ‘I just had to play.’

After spending a couple weeks on the shelf with a groin injury, senior goalkeeper Adrian Mucha was itching to get back into the lineup for **Bartlett**.

While he's still not 100%, there was no way he was missing Monday night's Upstate Eight Conference showdown against Streamwood.

“I did my normal warm-up routine and my groin felt better,” Mucha said. “Doing the kicks, I felt it but I always wanted to stay on the field. I’ve been watching these games.

“I feel bad just sitting on the bench. I just had to play (Monday).”

The Hawks are certainly glad he did. Mucha ended up making nine saves to keep **Bartlett** in the game, which wound up in a 0-0 tie.

Considering the Hawks (1-7-3, 0-1-1) entered the game with only one victory all season, it felt like a win, especially against a quality opponent in Streamwood (9-3-2, 1-0-1).

“He played outstanding,” **Bartlett** coach Anthony Glorioso said of Mucha. “It’s that weird energy you get from a huge save and kind of building off it.

“Seeing him out there after being hurt, it’s really nice to see. He makes a major difference — night and day.”

At the start of the day, Glorioso didn’t know if Mucha was going to be able to play. Glorioso was pleasantly surprised when he was informed that Mucha would give it a go.

“The captains came to me and said Adrian is ready to go and I’m like, ‘All right, let’s see it,’” Glorioso said.

“Big game and he was like, ‘You know, I think I can try it.’

“It was great to see him back between the pipes.”

Mucha and the Hawks had their hands full, however, with Streamwood junior AJ Sabanovic.

The star forward produced a handful of chances, including a header off a corner kick that Mucha saved in the first half. Sabanovic was a focus for the Hawks’ defense.

“I think he was getting frustrated from Adrian and some of our backs being on him,” Glorioso said. “He wanted a goal. He’s just been scoring a lot.”

Streamwood coach Matt Polovin said Sabanovic is an all-state player who was treated as such Monday.

“AJ was trying to work a little too hard, more than he normally does,” Polovin said.

“He knows he’s going to get double teamed. He knows he’s going to get his ankles whacked.

“He’s a marked man. I think he just needs to take a deep breath every once in a while and just play his game. He’s a high-class player. He’ll learn.”

Bartlett has scored 10 goals all season but applied plenty of pressure offensively, particularly in the first half.

Six of the Hawks’ seven shots on goal were in the first half, with four coming from Santiago Reyes. They could not find the back of the net, though.

“It’s an improvement,” Mucha said. “We don’t usually take too many shots, but this was a really good game.”

Having Mucha in the net trickled through the rest of the lineup, leading to those chances.

“That goes back to the whole energy thing,” Glorioso said. “We always bring it with Streamwood. The kids know each other. They step up their game no matter what. They knew it was a big game. We had a lot of energy.

“I was proud to see effort and resilience from our guys.”

And now that Mucha is back in the mix, the Hawks are hoping they can build off Monday's momentum.

“Elgin (on) Wednesday will be even tougher,” Mucha said. “I have to get prepared for that.”
