District U-46 board green-lights plans to build one new middle school, expand two others in Elgin area

The **District U-46** School Board signed off Monday on a proposal to move ahead with several Elgin-area school building projects, tentatively approving construction management contracts for two of them.

Under the plan, Kimball Middle School in Elgin and Kenyon Woods Middle School in South Elgin will be expanded, a new Elgin middle school will be built on land at 2604 Rohrssen Road, and Ellis and Abbott middle schools in Elgin will close at the end of the 2025-26 school year.

Contracts expected to be approved by the board Oct. 2 will pay Oakbrook Terrace-based International Contractors Inc. \$5.1 million to oversee the work at Kenyon Woods school and Gilbane Building Co., of Chicago, \$5 million to do the same with the Kimball addition and the new middle school.

Kenyon Woods is expected to cost between \$40 million and \$60 million and Kimball

between \$30 and \$40 million.

"With the size and scope of the projects that we have that will be coming on board over the next few years, it warrants a higher level of monitoring and guidance. And for that reason we recommended construction management firms," Deputy Superintendent for Operations Ann Williams told the board.

International Contractors already is overseeing the \$45 million conversion of Hawk Hollow Elementary School in Bartlett into a middle school that will roughly double its size.

The new middle school on Rohrssen Road, adjacent to Hilltop Elementary School, is to be built on 12.4 acres of undeveloped land at a price of \$90 million to \$130 million. No construction manager has been selected yet for that job.

Because of the construction work needed, the plan to move all sixth-graders into the middle school system will be postponed to the 2026-27 academic year.

U-46 Chief of Staff Brian Lindholm told the school board last week that it was urgent members make decisions on the projects being discussed because of the long lead times, supply chain issues and rising costs associated with construction.

The building projects come from recommendations made by the Unite U-46 steering committee, which were adopted last year by the board. A referendum approved by voters in April allows the district to issue \$179 million in school building bonds to help finance some of the work.

District reserve money and a 3% property tax increase next year also will help pay for school construction work and other renovation and maintenance needs included on a long list of projects to be carried out over the next few years.

For someone with a home valued at \$300,000, the property tax increase will add about \$168 to the portion of the bill paid to the district, officials said.

On Monday, board members also approved a new \$775.3 million budget for 2023-24, which is \$48.8 million more than the 2022-23 spending plan.

All told, the district plans to spend \$111 million on capital projects in the current fiscal year,

about \$50 million more than was spent last year.

Property taxes remain the chief source of district funding although a projected \$21 million increase in evidence-based state funding and an additional \$12 million in investment income will help, officials said.

- The Examiner -Software, SRO contracts approved by U-46 board

The **Board of Education in School District U-46** unanimously approved, via 7-0 votes, of a contract for school resource officers (SRO) as well as another for Microsoft software at its meeting on Monday, Sept. 11.

The SRO contracts will total \$1.2 million, from the education fund, with the villages of Bartlett, South Elgin and Streamwood as well as the City of Elgin for school resource officers (SRO) at the district's secondary schools.

The contracts include 14 total SROs, eight for middle schools and six for high schools. The total cost is an increase of 5 percent from last year.

It includes seven Elgin officers totaling \$545,662 (hourly overtime rate of \$71), three from Streamwood totaling \$251,620 (overtime \$73.81), two from South Elgin totaling \$200,759 (overtime \$76.14) and two from Bartlett totaling \$155,408 (overtime \$56.04).

The SROs are "in the interest of promoting, maintaining a safe, secure, and nurturing school learning environment that is flexible in meeting the academic, social, and emotional needs of each student, staff, and visitor," the proposal states.

The proposal adds: "The goal of the program is to create a safe school environment, while providing a law enforcement resource to school administrators, teachers, students and parents. The School Resource Officer will not enforce school rules, policy or discipline, but instead will serve the recommended TRIAD roles of: 1) Law Enforcement; 2) Teacher and;

3) Informal Counselor/Mentor."

As for the Microsoft software, the contract renewal costs \$25,679 (education fund), a 6.3 percent increase from last year, with Unified Business Solutions. The software "is used for the purchasing and financial reporting for the district," the proposal states. Additionally, the board voted 7-0 to approve \$15 million in itemized bills.

- The Examiner -U-46 students recognized for problem solving skills

The **Board of Education in School District U-46**, at its meeting on Monday, Sept. 11, recognized 15 students for their success in problem solving competitions.

All 15 won competitions at the Illinois Future Problem Solving Bowl last April in Bloomington-Normal, and 11 went on to win the Community Problem Solver category at the Future Problem Solvers International Competition in June at the University of Massachusetts. Ellen Smith, a fourth grade teacher at Streamwood's Glenbrook Elementary School, coached at the state competition while Madhuri Ganne and Uma Sangam, parent volunteers, coached at the international competition.

The 11 students who won at the international event were Bartlett High School's Yuvan Ganne, Nishi Sheth, Jaivir Singh, Krish Soni and Katelyn Wong along with Elgin High School's Mannat Ashta, Michelle Cardozo, Veer Gupta, Risha Lakkadi and Svanik Yachavaram and Andrew Punnoose of Elgin's Larsen Middle School

At the state competition, four students received the Bucky Award including Punnoose, Sophia Lee and Zinnia Saher of Larsen and Aiken Navarro of Elgin's Ellis Middle School.

The Bucky Award is "named for architect and inventor Buckminster Fuller," said Superintendent Suzanne Johnson, and is awarded "for their creative and futuristic solution to a problem."

Saher also placed first in the middle level and Bartlett's Neda Bazys first at the senior level for the Global Issue Problem Solving individual competition at state.

The competitions are connected to Future Problem Solving Program International (FPSPI) which is "an organization that seeks to develop the ability of young people to design and

achieve positive futures through problem solving using critical and creative thinking," Johnson said.

FPSPI's website states: "Future Problem Solving (FPS) teaches a unique six-step problem solving process which can be applied in the real world, in local and global communities, as well as in future societies. This six-step model teaches critical and creative thinking, problem solving, and decision making. Coaches and Teachers can teach the FPS problem solving model to their students in a classroom setting, in an after school program, or at home for home schoolers."
