Glenbard East forges three-way tie atop UEC by beating Glenbard South

After losing in the final seconds to **South Elgin** in Week 2, the Glenbard East coaching staff stressed the importance of closing out tight games.

On Friday night, the Rams proved they heard that message loud and clear at the most opportune time.

With the Upstate Eight conference title hanging in the balance, Glenbard East put together 48 minutes of outstanding football in a 28-14 home win over previously undefeated Glenbard South. The Rams, Raiders and **South Elgin** now all enter Week 9 atop the league standings with matching 7-1 records.

"We've worked hard every day since the summer, especially for this game," said Amonte Cook, who had both a receiving and rushing touchdown. "We all did our jobs. We all wanted this and everybody did great today.

"All three phases were great. But it begins in practice, everybody works hard in practice. There are no off days. And that starts with our coaches, (Coach John) Walters is a great coach."

Cook's 11-yard scoring run put Glenbard East ahead for good at 14-7 nearly midway through the second quarter. His 27-yard TD reception from Blake Salvino increased that margin shortly after halftime.

That was one of three touchdowns thrown by Salvino, who also connected with Gianbiagio Brusca for a 5-yard score and Chris Renford for a 58-yard strike. Salvino finished 12-of-15 through the air for 184 yards while also playing linebacker for a defensive unit that held a high-powered Raiders offense, averaging 47 points per game, in check.

The Rams have allowed just 64 points on the season, with no opponent scoring more than 17.

"This means a lot to us," Salvino said. "We have playoffs coming up and this gets us a better seed while also getting us ready for that. It's all about preparing us for the playoffs. We knew this was going to be a tough game but we prepared hard and came through with it.

"We have great defensive backs. They keep everything in front of them. And we have a great D-line that blows plays up and keeps pressure on the quarterback. All-around, our defense has been great."

Not to be forgotten was the rushing performance of Matthew Larson, who finished with 177 yards on 26 carries.

"This is huge," Larson said. "I feel like we've worked so hard. After we let one get away against **South Elgin**, this was our second chance. We were so grateful to have this opportunity and next week we will try to secure it (at least a share of the conference title).

"We had so much fire. We prepared all week and our O-line came out and played great. I think the biggest part of tonight was how our O-line and D-line played."

Renford finished with four catches for 85 yards while Brusca and Aaron Dotson contributed interceptions.

"I'm so proud of them," said defensive coordinator and 2008 Glenbard East grad Pat Walker, who was the acting-head coach with Walters away from the team due to a family matter. "It was a great effort and I'm so happy we finished the game.

"To give up 14 points against a team like that, a team with some unbelievable players, and then to close it out is a great thing. Against South Elgin we played well for 47 minutes and 50 seconds. But we didn't finish it out. We've been on them about closing it out and tonight we did." Notre Dame recruit Cam Williams brought in seven receptions for 122 yards for Glenbard South, scoring on a 60-yard pass from Michael Champagne that brought the visitors within 20-14. Champagne threw for 268 yards, which also included a 21-yard TD to Anthony Colby. Shaun Aderholt added an interception.

"They played very, very well," Glenbard South coach Ryan Crissey said. "They were the better football team. They won the line of scrimmage, they were more physical. It came down to fundamentals, of both blocking and tackling, and they were better in those areas.

"But we still have so much to play more and this is a special group. This type of loss puts things in perspective and gets us hyper-focused on what we need to improve on."

Rarely are games decided on the first play of the game.

This one was.

With only 18 seconds elapsed <mark>South Elgin</mark> running back Ari Kravis rambled 60 yards for a touchdown.

The Storm never looked back with a 49-7 win over **Bartlett** in an Upstate Eight Conference game in **Bartlett**.

"We played very well and the kids trusted the system," said South Elgin coach Dragon Teonic. "We got off to a very good start. We played very well at the line of scrimmage. This is a big rivalry. We think about this game 365 days a year."

South Elgin quarterback Kevon Brooks threw for 2 touchdowns and ran for another as the Storm

(7-1) led 28-0 after one quarter. Brooks tossed a 20-yard TD pass to Frank Maculuso and a 30-yard pass to Jabari Pruitt. The Storm quarterback also scored on an 8-yard TD run.

Brooks completed 10-of-13 passes for 122 yards which included a 20-yard TD pass to Ishmael George. George caught 6 passes for 95 yards.

"It was important we got off to a good start and a 28-0 lead," said Brooks. "This is a big game." With 11 players carrying the ball, the Storm ran for 282 yards on 33 carries.

South Elgin's defense held Bartlett to 66 total yards and 5 first downs.

Bartlett's only score came on a 32-yard pass from Vincent Yario to Nicholas Carlos.

With Glenbard East's 28-14 win over Glenbard South on Friday, the Storm is now in a three-way tie for first with the Rams and Raiders

By: Craig Brue 10/13/2023 Playing with an extra sense of purpose, <mark>Larkin's</mark> Erick Myrick enjoyed a memorable senior season performance against crosstown rival **Elgin** Friday night.

Myrick caught 3 touchdown passes and added an interception on the defensive side of the ball, helping lift Larkin (3-5, 3-5) to a 26-6 Upstate Eight Conference victory over the Maroons (1-7, 1-7) at Memorial Field.

With the win, the Royals secured the Town Jug for the third consecutive season.

"It means a lot for us," said Myrick, who finished with 4 receptions for 74 yards, including the Royals' first 2 touchdowns covering 22 and 20 yards, respectively, from junior quarterback Tizairian Johnson-Williams.

"We've been dealing with a lot of adversity. We just had to come out and prove ourselves again."

Larkin scored on its first offensive series, capping a 9-play, 37-yard drive with Myrick's touchdown reception on a 4th-and-goal play.

Elgin answered with a 4-play, 34-yard drive of its own following Lamyni Spates' 51-yard kickoff return. Spates finished the possession with a 1-yard touchdown run, but the Maroons botched the extra point try, leaving Larkin clinging to a 7-6 first-quarter advantage.

After senior inside linebacker Jalen Miller recovered a fumble, the Royals extended their lead to 13-6 when Johnson-Williams (5 of 14, 84 yards) threw his second TD pass of the game to Myrick.

Following a defensive stop, **Larkin** added another touchdown before halftime, as senior tailback Kevin Malone (9 carries, 94 yards) tiptoed down the sideline for 32 yards.

The Royals led 19-6 at halftime.

"They came out focused because it's always a game they get up for," said Royals first-year head coach Vincent Ray. "It's a community game. **Larkin** versus **Elgin** -- that's big time."

Larkin took the opening kickoff of the second half and marched into the red zone before turning the ball over, as **Elgin** junior Andres Marquez recovered a fumble at the Maroons' 10-yard line.

A 3-and-out series ensued, and the Royals put the game away with a 3-play, 45-yard drive, highlighted by Johnson-Williams' 23-yard touchdown pass to Myrick -- his third of the night.

"It was a great way to go out against them," said Myrick. "It was a great team win. I dedicate all my touchdowns to my father (Erick, Sr.). He passed away in January.

"That was my theme -- to come out and try to be a 'dog' for my father," he said.

Myrick's effort didn't surprise his head coach.

"He's a senior, he's a focused guy," said Ray. "He prepares well week in and week out. He's our go-to guy."

Miller led the Royals with 95 yards rushing on 11 carries, while Johnson-Williams added 35 yards on 9 carries.

"Tizairian had a nice night as well," said Ray, who served as the defensive coordinator during **Larkin's** 18-0 win over **Elgin** last season.

"As the head coach, it's good to have that (Town Jug) after losing the bucket to East Aurora."

Elgin was led by junior quarterback Darin Ward (8 of 15, 56 yards) and junior receiver Julio Soto (4 catches, 36 yards).

"They've got talent," **Elgin** coach Anthony Mason said of the Royals. "We couldn't find a hole on No. 3 (Myrick). We tried to lock him up and play over the top, but he kept getting loose.

"I felt like we came out with a good fight. I appreciate my guys for that."

A split decision works in Kevon Brooks' favor at quarterback for South Elgin. 'The transition has been smooth.'

Heading into the season, **South Elgin's** Kevon Brooks split reps at quarterback in practice with Jack Ginnan. Ultimately, it was Ginnan who would win the starting job.

But when Ginnan went down two weeks ago with a broken leg against Glenbard South, that meant the 5-foot-11, 153-pound junior was more than ready to go.

"The transition has been smooth," Brooks said. "I was on defense, but the transition to quarterback, since we had the same amount of reps, was just smooth.

"I trusted the system and trusted God, and it led me to right here."

Right here Friday night was leading the Storm to a 49-7 Upstate Eight Conference victory at rival Bartlett. Brooks completed 14 of 19 passes for 177 yards and four touchdowns.

Brook also ran for a TD and Jabari Pruitt caught two TD passes for **South Elgin** (7-1, 7-1). Ishmael George added six catches for 88 yards and a TD. Ari Kravis ran for 90 yards, including a 60-yard TD on the first play of the game.

The lone TD for Bartlett (4-4, 4-4) was a 38-yard pass from Vince Yario to Nicholas Carlos.

South Elgin coach Dragan Teonic has seen this script before in recent seasons. Several times, the Storm had to turn to a backup due to an injury, which is why he tries to split reps as often as possible.

"It's part of the deal," Teonic said. "KJ has really stepped up and improved as the years have gone on. I'm really proud of him. He's just a really nice football player.

"I think where he's really improved is as a passer. He's playing lights out right now — playing really well. He's composed. He's running the offense. He's making good decisions."

All Brooks had to do to get the Storm on the board to start the game was hand the ball off to Kravis, who raced 60 yards for the TD that set the tone for the easy win.

"I'm just proud of Ari," Teonic said. "It wasn't the goal to score on the first play, of course, but we want to score on the first drive. That's why we took the ball.

"I'm just proud because it was Ari. He's battled. He's put in so many hours of work. He's done so much right. That was awesome."

South Elgin jumped out to a 28-0 lead in the first quarter. Then in the second quarter, George got into the act. The team's leading receiver this season, he caught a 12-yard TD pass to make it 35-7.

George's connection with Ginnan was a big theme for the Storm early on this season. It hasn't changed with Brooks under center.

"It wasn't really a transition," George said. "He's been getting reps. I'm glad that he's stayed calm and isn't taking it as too much pressure. I'm glad he's dealing with the pressure really well.

"We're having a good connection. I've known him since I was a little kid."

The Storm also have bounced back from the 14-13 loss to Glenbard South, which ended their 29-game conference winning streak.

Glenbard South lost Friday to Glenbard East, meaning a win over **Streamwood** will still give **South Elgin** the title.
