The show commonly reaches out to local high school orchestras, making donations to their school music programs in exchange for student participation.

Philip Salvador,17, has been playing the violin for eight years. He also plays ukulele and piano. He is a member of the Elgin High Chamber Orchestra and has performed with pit orchestras for school musicals.

"With chamber orchestra, I enjoy playing the music of composers like Bach and Vivaldi and performing with people who share the same interests," said Philip.

The junior plans to enroll in a four year university after high school and pursue a degree in Pre-Medicine. He aspires to one day practice medicine.

Hannah Stewart,16, has been playing the violin for six years. She is a member of the EHS chamber Orchestra and has played with school pit orchestras.
