Half dozen candidates in the running so far for spring election to the Elgin City Council

Six candidates, including two Elgin City Council incumbents, submitted paperwork this week to have their names on the April 2023 election ballot.

Council members John Steffen and Rose Martinez, both seeking reelection to four-year terms, were joined by Anthony Ortiz, Karin Jones, Diana Alfaro and Christina "Tia" Aagesen.

Councilwoman Tish Powell has said she plans to run for a fourth term but had not filed her nominating her nominating petitions as of Tuesday afternoon. Councilman Toby Shaw is not seeking reelection.

In addition to four council seats, the mayor's job is also open. Incumbent Mayor <u>David Kaptain</u> plans to run for a fourth term but has not yet filed nor have any challengers.

The last day to submit election nominating petitions is Monday, Nov. 28.

Ortiz and Jones have run for council seats previously.

Oritz is a former U.S. Marine who works with the Kane County State's Attorney's Office. He was one of the driving forces behind the renaming of an Elgin street in honor of a fallen Marine Cpl. Alex Martinez and has helped organize Mexican Independence Day events.

Jones is an Elgin Planning and Zoning commissioner as well as a business owner and area volunteer.

Shaw, a Judson University alum and a fiscally conservative voice on the council, said it was time to end his tenure. He was elected in 2013.

"I have really enjoyed my time on the council," Shaw said. "It's been a great opportunity to learn and serve the community."

Once nominating petitions are submitted, objections can be filed at the Elgin City Clerk's

Office by 5 p.m. Dec. 5.

The spring election will also include races for village, school and park boards, including seats on the School District U-46 School Board and the Dundee Township Park Board.

Candidates for those seats will file their nominating petitions Dec. 12-19.
