South Elgin earns 16th straight home win

Larkin was able keep pace with <mark>South Elgin</mark> in the early part of Friday night's Upstate Eight Conference contest.

At one point in the first quarter, the Royals tied the Storm and only trailed 14-6 at the end of the period.

However, South Elgin's effective triple-option offense kicked into high gear in the second quarter and the Storm pulled away to win its 16th home game in a row, 47-12.

"You've got to respect the triple-option because if you don't, we run hard and if you do, receivers are open," said South Elgin quarterback Jake Sullivan, who threw 4 touchdown passes.

South Elgin coach Dragan Teonic was not surprised by the Royals' tenacity.

"Totally what we expected. They are in games, they are a team that's improving," Teonic said. "We knew they were tough. They had other scoring opportunities that we were able to quash."

South Elgin (4-0, 4-0) scored on the first drive of the game. Mason Montgomery finished the possession when he took Sullivan's pitch and rumbled for 8 yards to put his team on the scoreboard, leading 6-0 with 8:13 left in the first quarter.

The <mark>Storm</mark> immediately got the ball back on an onside kick, but the drive stalled at the <mark>Royals</mark>' 25-yard line. Larkin (1-3, 1-3) took over and marched down field to cross the goal line on Jalen Miller's 15-yard run at the 2:37 mark of the first quarter. South Elgin's Denver Davis and Jordan Green blocked the extra-point try, so the Royals were only able to tie the Storm 6-6.

The tie was short-lived as South Elgin scored on its next possession. Ari Karvis ended a 65-yard drive with a 1-yard plunge with 42 seconds left in the quarter. The two-point conversion was good putting the Storm up 14-6 to start the second quarter.

South Elgin executed another successful onside kick. A drive that started in the first quarter and ended with 9:57 left in the second quarter resulted in another Storm score on a 14-yard Sullivan pass to a leaping Kyle Steinhofer in the end zone.

Larkin responded with Miller's second score of the game on a 3-yard plunge at the 7:11 mark of the period.

Montgomery and Steinhofer both notched their second touchdowns of the night on second-quarter passes from Sullivan, who finished 7-of-14 for 96 yards. At halftime South Elgin led 34-12.

South Elgin added 2 more touchdowns in the third quarter. Montgomery scored his third touchdown on a 19-yard pass from Sullivan. Jordan Green crossed the goal line on a 3-yard run.

In addition to completing 2 passes for 29 yards, Montgomery rushed 115 yards on 9 carries. Teammate Lucas Noworol gained 110 yards on 9 attempts.

Larkin threatened to score again in the third quarter. A 64-yard pass from Tizairian Johnson-Williams (10 for 23 for 177 yards) to Chevelle Clements (5 completions for 125 yards) put the Royals at South Elgin's 9-yard line. A bad snap recovered by the Storm's Damiel Viscuso ended the threat.

Triple-option tweak: Jacob Sullivan throws 4 TD passes as undefeated South Elgin runs past Larkin. 'It's a very intricate offense.'

Being a quarterback in South Elgin's triple-option scheme demands toughness because that player is going to get hit.

Jacob Sullivan, a 6-foot, 191-pound junior, likes to take on that challenge head-on. What he adds to the mix, however, is a strong arm to keep defenses honest.

"You have to respect the triple option," Sullivan said. "When you don't, we just run it hard. When you do, people are open. It's a very intricate offense."

The Storm dominated on the ground as they usually do during Friday's 47-12 Upstate Eight Conference victory over Larkin, but Sullivan also threw four touchdown passes.

"It's such an advantage, because when it's executing on all cylinders like it was at times (Friday), the defense will suck in," Sullivan said. "That's why I threw four touchdowns."

South Elgin coach Dragan Teonic doesn't take the advantage he has for granted.

"In this instance, Larkin was using their safeties to fill up on the run with the option game," Teonic said. "That opens up some opportunities down the field, and Jake hit them."

South Elgin (4-0, 4-0) took a 14-6 lead in the first quarter on a 14-yard TD run by Mason Montgomery and a 1-yard TD run by Ari Kravis. The Storm then started looking to the air.

Sullivan hit <u>Kyle Steinhofer</u> with a 14-yard strike for his first TD with 9:57 left in the second quarter.

The Storm's next three TDs all came through the air. Sullivan sandwiched TD passes of 10 and 19 yards to Montgomery around a 40-yard scoring strike to Steinhofer.

Sullivan ended up completing 8 of 15 passes for 122 yards.

"A lot of triple-option teams will focus so much on the run," Sullivan said. "We really focus on having an open game.

"If we get stopped on the triple option, we know we can go wide and throw the ball. It adds so much to our offense."

South Elgin did dominate on the ground, however.

The Storm ran for 365 yards and three TDs on 51 carries. Lucas Norowol and Montgomery each went for over 100 yards — Norowol with 123 and Montgomery with 107.

Jordan Green added a 1-yard TD run.

Larkin (1-3, 1-3) made it a game early on, though.

The <mark>Royals</mark> forced a 6-6 tie in the first on a 15-yard TD run from Jalen Miller. Miller struck again in the quarter, this time on a 4-yard run, to cut Larkin's lead to 20-12.

The Royals had a few big plays the rest of the way but weren't able to slow down South Elgin's offense to stay in the game.

Tizairan Johnson-Williams threw for 157 yards. Chevelle Clements caught four passes for 107 yards.

Teonic, a former head coach for Larkin, likes what he sees from coach Grant Dietz's program.

"They're doing an awesome job putting their guys in position," Teonic said. "I said — keep your chin up, because they're in games. You can see improvement. It's a team on the rise.

"I've been there before. I know what it looks like. He's doing stuff right, and those kids have to continue to believe in what he's doing because you can see the improvement. It's tangible."

South Elgin rolls into homecoming next week against East Aurora with 16 straight home wins.

Teonic will be leaning on Sullivan to continue to add to that total.

"He's not even come close to his ceiling," Teonic said. "That's why we coach him so hard. He craves to be coached hard. He wants to be the best that he can be.

"Jake is so much better than he was as a sophomore, but he's got a long way to go. That's what I mean with his ceiling. How good can he get?"
