School District U-46 has had school restrooms damaged in recent weeks by vandals responding to a challenge posted on the TikTok social media platform, according to district spokeswoman Mary Fergus.

The district has had to replace about 80 restroom soap dispensers in middle and high schools across the district, Fergus said. At \$15 per dispenser, the cost has added up to about \$1,200, she said.

Some of the vandals have been caught and are facing disciplinary action as outlined in the district's student code of conduct, Fergus said.

TikTok recently blocked users from viewing any videos with the "devious lick" hashtag, which led to video clips of students vandalizing school restrooms.
