State superintendent of education visits U-46's Creekside and Channing elementary schools in Elgin

Illinois State Superintendent of Education Carmen Ayala visited Creekside and Channing elementary schools in Elgin Tuesday to learn more about District U-46's dual language program and U-46 Rising initiative.

At Creekside, Ayala listened to third-graders in a dual language classroom read poems they had written in English and Spanish, a news release said. During her stop at Channing, she spoke with students participating in academic teaming, a core component of U-46 Rising.

Creekside and **Channing** were among the initial group of “Schools for Rigor and Equity,” which serve as models for **U-46 Rising**, an effort to ensure that the district’s programs work for all students, the release said. Its focus is on improving classroom instruction through academic teaming.

U-46 has about 12,000 students enrolled in the dual language program from preschool through 12th grade, making it one of the largest programs of its kind in the United States, the release said.

Ayala was accompanied by **Superintendent Tony Sanders**, **Channing Elementary** Principal Rebecca Lunak and **Creekside** Principal Joel Pollack.

She also met **Streamwood High School** senior Rossi Guterrez, a new member of the Illinois State Board of Education’s Student Advisory Council. Gutierrez has served for the past two years on the superintendent’s student advisory council and on Streamwood High’s principal’s advisory board.
